—The funeral of the late George Clark, Wilnot Valley, takes place on Sunday at two p. m. Burial at Freetown Cemetery.

—Traffic on the western end of the railway was again slightly disturbed yesterday. The regular train from Tignish due in Summerside at 10.35 a. m. did not arrive till 3.30 p. m. The morning train from the East was nearly three hours late. The strong wind of the night before had driven the snow into the cuttings.
—Another land mark has been removed. The death took place yesterday the 14th inst. about noon, of George Clark, Wilnot Valley, at the advanced age of 92 years. Mr Clark had been in good health up to about three weeks ago when he had the misfortune of falling on the slippery steps at his own door, receiving injuries from which he did not fully recover. He was born at Bedoue and a much respected resident, well and favorably known. He was proprietor of Clark's Mills for over forty years, a consistent member of Bedoue Methodist Church from his youth. He leaves to mourn one son and two daughters. Even the present proprietor of Clark's Mills, Mrs H. D. McEwen, Morell and Helen at home.
—At the regular meeting of Court Muniwawa I. O. Foresters, Bedoue on Saturday evening last, the following officers were elected for 1910: Court Deputy—Albert Schurman; Chief Ranger—L. U. Fowler; Vice Chief, F. W. Davison; Past Chief, A. H. Ailbeck; Rec. Secy, Edward Hooper; Fin. Secy, J. B. Downes; Treasurer, E. H. Howatt; Physician, J. C. Ballum, M.D.; Orator, Thomas Moss; Organist, P. C. Downes; Sr Woodward, Thos. J. Inman; Jr Woodward, P. L. Jewell; Sr Beadle, J. A. Murray; Jr Beadle, Charles Lord; Trustees, L. W. Trueman, John Davidson. The invitation of the Chief Ranger to make the next meeting a social one at his house was accepted with thanks.
—William Henry Leslie, died suddenly at his home in Kensington, on January 6th, after a short but fatal illness of pneumonia. He was the only son of H. A. Leslie, Kensington, and was born in Summerside in 1874. He received his early education in the High School in Kensington, and on leaving school learned the cheese and butter making in the Kensington Factory under A. S. Raby. On the retirement of the latter, from the factory here, Mr Leslie was appointed to succeed him, and this position he held up to his recent fatal illness. He found the factory in a high state of efficiency and he not only maintained it at that degree, but raised it to higher levels. He was also manager of the Hamilton Cheese Factory and this, too, he improved to a satisfactory degree. He was a citizen whom any community would desire to possess and who seemed destined for a long and useful career. His funeral took place on January 10, and was attended by a large concourse of sorrowing friends. The pallbearers were: Dr James Keir, Edgar Keir, John S. Cousins, Geo. Riley, Wm Sheen, Wm Orr. He was a member of the Masonic Order under whose auspices the funeral was held. He was also a member of Court Prince Edward, I. O. O. F. The funeral services were conducted by Rev A. W. Nicholls. Mr Leslie will be greatly missed by his many friends and years hence will his name be recalled with fond remembrance. The widow has lost a husband who was loving, kind and indulgent, and who spared no pains to contribute to the happiness of his beloved wife. The children have lost a father whose kind yet firm discipline was ever exercised for their happiness, and the parents have lost a son on whom they had lavished much affection and who was ever found obedient and grateful. The widow, children and parents are thoroughly appreciative of all the kindnesses and assistance given them during their sore affliction and for the beautiful floral contributions.

—In Summerside yesterday dealers were paying 94 cents a lb for pork; 32 cents a lb for hides; 25c a doz for eggs; \$8.50 a ton for loose hay; \$4.50 a ton for loose straw; 20 cents a bus for potatoes and 18 to 25c a lb for butter and 40 to 45c a bus for oats.

—As a mark of their esteem and goodwill the Methodist people at Union Corner, Lot 15, on the Bideford circuit, recently presented their pastor Rev. E. S. Weeks, with a beautiful and costly pair of driving mitts. The gift was very much appreciated, as the drives on the circuit are long, and the chain of sympathetic interest between pastor and people is becoming stronger and stronger.

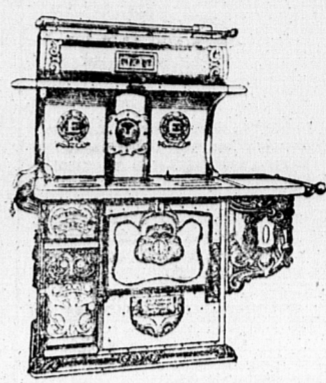
