Mr. John McLeod, of Ebenezer, New Glasgow Road, met with a sad and fatal accident Saturday evening.

The deceased had not been feeling well for a few days, but was able to be at her usual duties on the day previous to her death.

Shortly after retiring for the night she was seized with a sudden attack, but even with the best medical assistance the battle of death was fought unsuccessfully, and she sank to her final rest.

Her period of life had not been long, but it was an exemplary one.

All persons who have visited her home know the kindness of her nature, the agreeableness of her disposition and her pleasant companionship.

The great number of persons who have known her as a friend will miss her greatly, but it is upon her husband and children the burden falls most heavily. To them she was a model wife and mother.
