Fish Cakes.

To two cups of rice or mashed potatoes, add a cup of shredded cooked fish, one beaten egg, four tablespoons milk, salt and pepper. Beat this well and drop by spoonfuls into hot fat. When browned, dry on brown paper, and serve with a garnish of sliced pickles.

Creamed fish, either with toast or mashed potatoes, is a good way to use left-over fish. Or it may be scalloped with bread crumbs.

BOLD ROBBERY SUNDAY NIGHT

A daring robbery was committed in this city Sunday night when the residence of Mr. Murdoch G. Anderson, 297 Richmond Street was entered Sunday evening, between 6.30 and 7.30 o'clock, almost day light, and about \$200.00 in cash stolen from a desk.

When Mr. and Mrs. Anderson returned from church about 8.30 and the former tried to insert his door key in the lock he could not do so. He called in Mr. Leo Doyle, contractor, who lives next door and it was found a key was in the lock inserted from the inside and slightly turned so as it could not be pushed from the outside.

Mr. Doyle raised a window and entered, opening the front door easily from the inside, admitting Mr. and Mrs. Anderson, who immediately went to the room where the desk containing the money was.

They found this desk had been opened, also by a key and the contents of the drawer, nearly \$200.00 taken.

Wet foot marks were tracked from the front door along the hall to where the desk was located, and around the desk were found burned matches. The burglars took the precaution of drawing the blinds white at work.

The lock on the front door is a Yale lock and Mr. Doyle states it is remarkable that a key could be secured to fit it so neatly.

The parties seemingly were well posted as how and when to enter and where the cash was located.

It is understood there are no clues, excepting the foot-prints, and it could not be ascertained if any articles such as jewelry, etc., are missing.

The matter has been reported to the police and until midnight last night no arrests were made.
