B., Dec. 3.—Commencing Monday, Dec. 17th, and continuing until including Jan. 2nd next, there will be a double train service daily except Sunday between the mainland and Prince Edward Island, according to an announcement from regional headquarters of the Canadian National Railways here. The additional service from the mainland will be by the Ocean Limited leaving Moncton at 4:10 p.m. and connecting at Sackville with train leaving there at 5:45 p.m. for Prince Edward Island, arriving Charlottetown at 10:45 p.m. (Summerside 10:15 p.m.) Leaving Charlottetown train will depart Tignish at 10:30 a.m. (Summerside 10:30 a.m.) arriving Sackville 4:10 p.m. where connections will be made with the Ocean Limited for Sydney and Halifax and with trains for Montreal and points west. The present train service leaving Moncton at 11:15 a.m. and Charlottetown 6:45 a.m. (Summerside 6:45 a.m.) remains as at present.

Effective for the same period, a train will be operated from Emerald Jct. to Summerside, leaving Emerald Jct. 9:20 p.m. daily except Sunday and arriving Summerside 10:15 p.m.

On Dec. 21, 22 and 24, train will leave Summerside for Borden at 3:20 p.m. instead of 3:00 p.m., arriving Borden at 6:30 p.m., making the same connections at Emerald Jct. as at present.

On Dec. 21, 22 and 24, train will leave Summerside for Tignish at 4:30 p.m. instead of 12:01 p.m., arriving Tignish at 10:30 p.m. On Dec. 22, a train will also be operated leaving Summerside at the same time and arriving Tignish 8:30 p.m. From Tignish a train will be operated on Dec. 22 leaving there at 9:30 p.m. and arriving Summerside 12:30 a.m. next morning.
