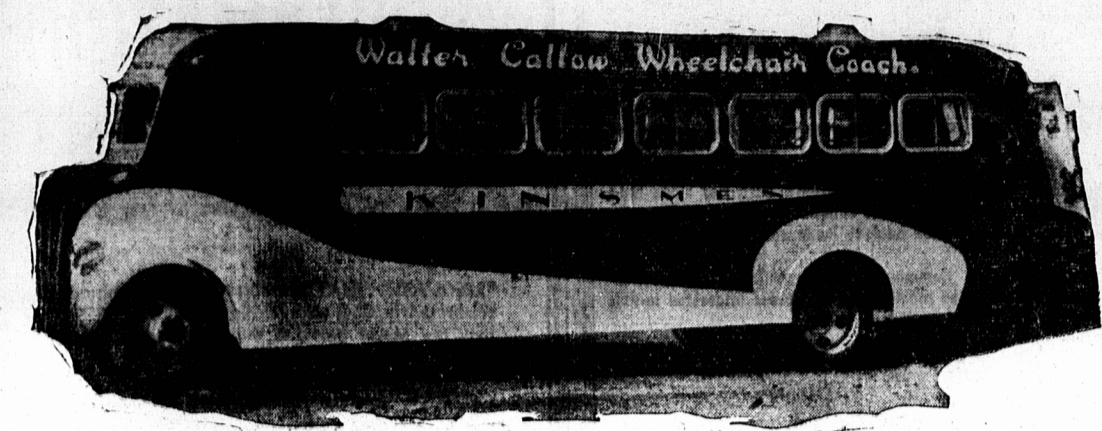


Wheel Chair Coach To Be Shown Here
