DEEP MYSTERY IN WOMAN'S DISAPPEARANCE

BOSTON, July 20—The disappearance of Mrs. Lillian C. Nickerson, of Jamaica Plain, a forewoman in Plant's shoe factory, has caused a great deal of mystery. Some say that she committed suicide—some say that she was the victim of foul play.

She has been traced aboard one of the Joy liners at Providence, on her way to join her husband at New York. She was aboard the boat when it sailed Thursday evening, July 20.

When the boat arrived in New York she failed to leave it, as far as can be learned. She had given the pursuer her money—some \$40 and her jewelry. In her stateroom was found her hat and her bag.

Mrs. Nickerson has been living at 20 Eggleston street, Jamaica Plain, for the last three years. She is about 35 years old, light complexion. She weighs about 140 pounds and is five feet, four inches tall.

She has been forewoman in one of the departments of the T. G. Plant shoe factory in Jamaica Plain and has earned large pay there for years. She has been married for the last five years. Until about six months ago she and her husband lived together on Eggleston street, in the house owned by Charles Wolf. Their life there was of the happiest, according to the people in the house.

About six months ago her husband secured a position in a New York Hotel as clerk. Since that time they have been corresponding regularly. Fourth of July, Nickerson came on from New York. It was at that visit that the couple made arrangements for her visit to New York as soon as she could take her vacation.

At the first of last week the Plant factory closed down for the summer shut down. As soon as Mrs. Nickerson could make arrangements she was to go to New York.

On Thursday she left her home at Eggleston street, happy in the anticipation of a long vacation with her husband. She had been looking forward to it, and had shared her delight at the prospect with her neighbors.

She secured a ticket to New York via Providence and the Joy Line. Her movements until she went aboard the boat have been traced with but little difficulty.

After she deposited her money and jewelry with the purser of the boat, all trace of her ceases. Her husband is positive that she did not commit suicide. Her neighbors are equally positive that she could have had no slightest motive for self destruction.

She had been in good health. As far as her husband knows she had not a single worry in the world. What happened aboard the boat her husband is unable to learn.

Nickerson feels that the officers of the company are not willing enough to enter into the search, they would not advance any theory to account for the woman's disappearance.

It was only after persistent inquiries, Nickerson claims, that he was able to discover that her money and valuables were still unclaimed from the purser and that her hat and bag had been found in her stateroom.

Nickerson declares that his wife met with foul play, in some way on board the liner. He refuses to entertain even the possibility of suicide.

Determined to prosecute his search to some definite conclusion, Nickerson has determined to invoke the aid of the police, and to place before the police his suspicions aroused during his trail over the route taken by the wife.
