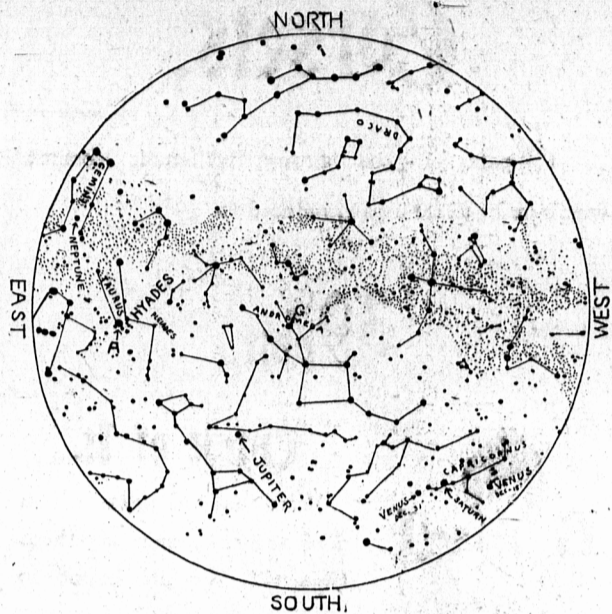

HEAVENS IN DECEMBER BY PROF. E. DOOLITTLE

University of Pennsylvania Astronomer—Venus Moving Rapidly Eastward.—The Hyades.—The Moon Will Pass Between us and the Planet Mars on December Second.

Four planets may be seen in the evening sky during December. First, toward the southwest, is the brilliant evening star, Venus by the end of this year is the second brightest object in the heavens. Then, a little to the east of Venus, is the planet Saturn which is still in good position for observation with a small telescope. The earth is elevated nearly fifteen degrees above the rings so that we look down upon them and see them well opened out. To the south, two-thirds of the way up to the zenith is the planet Jupiter, the most striking and brilliant object of the entire sky, and finally, low down in the



Venus as it appears when near the earth.

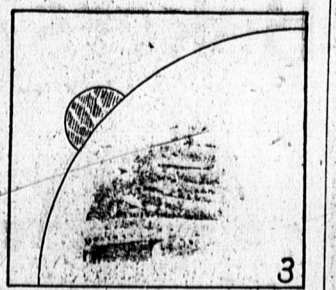

east, the possessor of a small telescope may pick up the faint greenish planet Neptune.

THE PLANET VENUS.

If the observer will turn toward the southwest soon after sunset he cannot fail to notice this brilliant planet, which is now the brightest object in the whole sky with the single exception of Jupiter. It is at present moving rapidly eastward among the stars so that while it sets two and one-half hours after the sun on December 1, by January 1, it has reached so high an altitude that it does not set until three and one-half hours after sunset.

Though Venus comes nearer to the earth than any other planet, very little is known of its surface conditions. This is because it seems to be surrounded by so dense an atmosphere that we can probably never catch sight of the solid globe at all; our telescope shows us only the clouds and vapor which float above the ground. It is known, however, that the planet is 7700 miles through, very nearly as large as the earth, and that it is almost as heavy as the earth. It is probable that its temperature is not very unlike the temperature of the earth.

THE NEBULA OF ANDROMEDA.

The observer should not fail to look nearly overhead to the point marked G on the map, where will be found the nebula of Andromeda. This great nebula is so bright that it can be seen without any telescope at all, but a naked eye view gives no suggestion of the magnificent appearance which it presents when viewed with a moderately large glass. It is then seen to be an immense, oblong, nebulous mass, surrounded by a fainter nebulosity which is more or less definite separated into rings encircling the bright nucleus. The whole appears to be a vast solar system in process of formation.

THE OCCULTATION OF MARS AND ALDEBARAN.

On the morning of December 2, the moon will pass between us and the planet Mars. As the edge of the moon draws nearer and nearer to the ball of the planet the contrast between the bright yellow of the moon and the red color of Mars will present a striking and beautiful sight. If viewed with a telescope the moon's edge will be seen to gradually advance over the ball of the planet, as shown in fig. 3, without a telescope it can only be seen that the light of Mars fades gradual

away as the moon passes over it. This occultation will begin at 2 hrs. 16 min. A. M., Eastern time, and the planet will remain hidden by the moon for a little more than an hour. At 3 hrs. 16 min. Mars will begin to come into view as it emerges from the western edge of the moon.

On December 30, in the early evening the moon will pass over the bright star Aldebaran. Its eastern edge will reach the star and shut it from view at 8 hrs. 25 min., eastern time, and the emergence will occur at 9 hrs. 49 min. The observer will notice that while the light of Mars will fade gradually away as the moon passes over it, the light of Aldebaran will be blotted out instantaneously. This is because Mars appears to us as a round disc, while every star appears as but a single point of light. The instant the edge of the moon reaches this point of light, the star simply goes out, with a suddenness far more rapid than that of a flash of lightning.

THE PLANETS.

Saturn and Jupiter can readily be found from the positions marked on the map. Saturn will move slowly eastward during the month, and Jupiter slowly westward until December 15, when it will turn and move toward the east again.

Neptune is in Gemini midway between the stars Zeta and Mu. It is exactly opposite the sun and in most favorable position for observation on December 28.

The most interesting planet Mars is beginning to be a conspicuous object in the early morning hours though it is still so far away from us that the surface markings cannot be seen very well even in large telescopes. On December 1 it rises at a quarter past one o'clock in the morning and on January 1 about two hours earlier. By next spring it will be in excellent position for observation in the early evening.

SCHOONER MARYLAND ASHORE.

WHITFIELD, N.S. Nov. 28.—The Gloucester schooner Maryland, 90 tons, Capt. Fuft, from Newfoundland, bound home with a cargo of salt herring stranded on False Rock when leaving the harbor this morning about one o'clock. An unsuccessful attempt was made to float the vessel at high tide today. She is not leaking and is in a good position. The steamer Strathcona will try to pull her off the rocks. With her cargo the Maryland is valued at \$17,000, and she is covered by an insurance of \$18,000. The schooner was one of the best in the Gloucester fleet.
