THE STATION SITE.

A voluminous return of 88 typewritten pages embodying copies of all correspondence with the Government re the location and building of a new railway station at Charlottetown was brought down in Parliament on May 22nd in response to a motion of Mr. Martin, M. P. for Queens.

Idea of putting the new station where the old one is, changing the roundhouse east and the station proper to the corner of Prince and Water street. On July 19 another letter from Mr. Farquharson to Mr. Pottinger says: "The site will of course be where it is now, putting the station where the round house is."

We have yet no definite information as to whether or not submarine boats had any share in the destruction of the Russian ships the other day.

The synopsis of correspondence re the station site in another column is timely in view of the expected visit of the Minister of Railways. We believe our people are as much as ever in favor of the George Street site and will never voluntarily consent to any compromise that would carry the new station further east than the present round house.

As a result of the destruction of the Russian fleet Britain has now a naval tonnage more than equal to that of the three next strongest naval powers. The figures are:—Great Britain's tonnage is 1,595,871 tons. France, 608,721 tons. Germany, 441,249 tons. United States, 316,522 tons.

Two hundred years ago Peter the Great, who well deserves that name as the greatest Russian in all history, saw the need of a navy for his country. So great was his zeal that he visited Holland and actually worked as a ship carpenter to learn all about the business of building ships.

EIGHT MEN BURIED ALIVE.

MONTROSE, Colo., May 31.—It is feared that at least eight of the twenty men buried by the cave-in at the Munition Reclamation tunnel are dead, as those men were at work at the point where the ground fell in. Two men, caught in the timbers, are known to be still alive, and strong hopes are entertained that most of the imprisoned men will be rescued through the shaft that is being sunk.
