THE INCREASING TRADE OF CANADA

OTTAWA, April 15.—(Special)—The trade figures for the first three quarters of the fiscal year indicate that the commercial record is again to be broken more decisively than ever before.

The total trade for the nine months is nearly three hundred and eighty four millions, fifty millions more than last year's record for the same time.

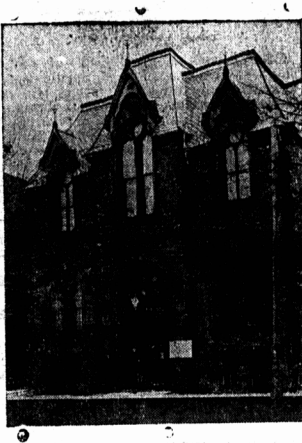

THE AHERN MURDER INQUEST

New Witnesses Examined—Who Failed to Identify the Man they Suspected—Jury Recommend That Hackett Be Held and Sent Before Criminal Court.

MONTREAL, April 15.—(Special)—The Ahern child murder inquest was concluded Saturday, the new witnesses being a boy named Poirier and Mrs. Taylor, both of Cote St. Paul.

The boy picked out a newspaper reporter as the man he thought he saw with the little girl, and Mrs. Taylor was uncertain.

They were among those who saw man and child in that vicinity on the day of the murder. When it came to identifying in a room full of people they totally failed to further strengthen the Crown.

The jury recommended that Hackett be held criminally responsible and sent before the criminal court for trial.

THE NAVIGATION OF HUDSON'S BAY

The Wonderful Mineral Wealth of the Country Around the Bay—The Seal Fisheries. The Ice Fields and Icebergs. The Season of Navigation.

OTTAWA, April 14.—Four months for ordinary vessels and a little longer for reinforced vessels is the term during which navigation can be carried on in Hudson's Bay and Strait.

The feasibility of navigation was the main point dwelt upon in the address. Sealing operations begin about May 1st but by July 1st and still more safely on July 15th, the straits and bay are open to navigation.

During the same voyage, Mr. Low explored the resources and found copper on the west, and iron on the east side of the Bay, while a Scotch company is taking out some excellent mica on the northern shore of the strait.

While the question of the navigation of the Hudson's Bay and Straits might not appear to interest Eastern Canada, directly, it must eventually affect it.
