CITIZENS CONVEGNE IN 'SIDE

And Last Night Discuss Civic Matters

COUNCIL RECEIVE THANKS

The C. T. A. the Labor Question and Other Matters

Attention

THE Citizens' Meeting in Market Hall last night was largely attended. Donald Campbell acted, Chairman.

Mayor McNeill briefly reviewed the Town finances and the work done during the past year.

Capt. Read moved, seconded by R. S. Bowness, that a vote of thanks be tendered the Mayor and Council for their services. Motion carried.

Allan McKinnon asked who was responsible for the expenditure for the School Board.

The Mayor explained that although the School Board vouchers were not public the auditors were appointed by the Council and a general statement was published with the town accounts.

In referring to the question, Neil McLeod thought this was a pertinent matter. The expenditure for schools was the largest in the civic expenditure and the amount this year was larger than previous years. To this he was not objecting but the people had a right to see vouchers. The Board was somewhat anonymous and the citizens had no control over them. He did not see why the board was not elected by citizens.

J. A. Brace, a trustee, accounted for the extra expenditure as being much needed repairs to the High School.

Here a discussion took place between Coun. Clark and Neil McLeod relative to a statement made by the latter that measures for consolidation of Incorporation Act were taken in a hole and corner way.

Mayor McNeill showed consolidation was necessary and that it was not done in an underhand way.

Rev. W. H. Smith referred favorably to the Town finances but he would like in the future that a stronger effort be made to enforce the C. T. A. He moved the following resolution:—

Whereas the illegal sale of intoxicating liquors is productive of much injury to the community and is opposed to the principle of good government it is the opinion of the citizens of Summerside now convened for the purpose of considering public questions that the incoming Town Council should energetically enforce the Scott Act and if necessary appoint a special prosecutor who would carry out the law.

The resolution was seconded by E. H. Wright and carried.

The question of taxing non-resident laborers was discussed by John Cunningham and others.

Coun. Morris mentioned that the matter had been considered by the Town Council and would be included in the consolidation of the Incorporation Act. He moved that this meeting support the principle. The motion was seconded by John D. Goss and carried.

Neil McQuarrie suggested that an effort be made to improve the town so as to attract strangers and also place more work in the way of the laborer.

After a vote of thanks to the chairman the meeting closed.
