QUEER CUSTOMS OF AFRICANS

CAIRO June 14.—Some remarkable tribal customs have just been reported by an expedition sent into the comparatively unknown countries between the Abyssinian capital and the north-west of Lake Rudolf in the neighborhood of the Anglo-Abyssinian boundary.

Three Shankalla tribes have each their own custom and dialect. In one case, the ruler might never touch water, and when his curiosity to see a white man made him break the "tabu" his man had to carry him over every stream lest he should be defiled.

In another tribe, when a father is getting on in years, the son bids him climb into a tree and jump down from the branches. If the old man staggers on landing, the son spears him on the spot. His usefulness is over.

One tribe has a custom of sewing chance visitors up in fresh hides and leaving them to be killed by the contraction of the skins; in another the only orthodox way of dealing with strangers was to tie them in a bundle and roll them over a precipice.

In the Sorma country, where the natives are elephant hunters and eaters, the woman are of a particularly repulsive type. They make a practice of disfiguring themselves by distending their lower lips until they hang almost down to the breast. This is brought about by means of a saucer of clay which they insert in the lower lip.

CANADA A RIVAL OF THE U. S. IN ELECTRICAL MACHINERY.

The largest generator ever made in this country has just been made ready for shipment to British Columbia from the works of the Canadian Westinghouse Company, of Hamilton. The purchaser is the British Columbia Electric Railway Company, of Vancouver. The generator is 2,000 horse power, 3 phases, 7,200 alternations, 200 revolutions per minute, with engine pipe for direct connection, with the water wheel. The order also includes one rotary converter of 1,350 horse power, 350 volts, 3 phases, 7,200 alternations, 400 revolutions per minute, and eight air blast transformers each of 738 horse power, 2,200 volts to 24,200 volts, 7,200 alternations. The necessary switch boards for regulating and controlling the devices were also manufactured in this plant, and will be shipped with the balance of the order in the course of a day or two.

The new machinery is required by the Vancouver company to provide added power to meet the ever increasing demand of Vancouver and vicinity. It is the fourth generator of the size ordered by the Vancouver company, but the other three were supplied by the Westinghouse company from its Pittsburgh works previous to the building of the Hamilton works. The one now ready for shipment is by long odds the largest ever manufactured in Canada.

TREATMENT FOR INFECTED CATTLE

OTTAWA, June 14.—Dr. Rutherford, Dominion Veterinary Inspector, recently visited Napan, where some time ago tuberculosis was found to exist among the cattle on the model farm. The cattle have now been sent to Ottawa, where experiments are being made with them and where they are undergoing similar treatment to human beings suffering from consumption, and a marked improvement in their condition has been noticed. Some of them have now almost entirely recovered.

While not wishing to cause unnecessary alarm, Dr. Rutherford says that the number of tubercular cattle in the maritime provinces is very large, although perhaps not much worse than other countries with similar climate and conditions which cause the cattle to be confined in the barns such a large proportion of the year. As to the danger to human beings which results therefrom, Dr. Rutherford said that this was a much discussed question, over which there is still considerable doubt. Milk from an animal in the later stages of the disease he considered dangerous, especially to young children. In regard to the meat the danger, he says, is hardly as great as is generally supposed, the meat being nearly all removed by cooking. To an adult in good health the risk is practically nil.

A BRIGHT DREAM OF THE CHINESE

LONDON, June 14.—English schools in China all crowded to excess, and every Chinaman desirous of learning the English language, are the proofs that British prestige has not suffered in China, says Mr. Rankin Leslie, district manager in Canton of the Sun Life Assurance Company of Canada, who is now on a visit to Montreal. The English, in fact, are held in high respect by the Chinese, who do not desire to learn either French or German, while as for the Americans their influence is all gone. The hanging of the Morgan syndicate over the Canton and Han kow railway, resulting in the Chinese buying back the concession, was a serious blow to American prestige, and afterwards the boycott simply finished the Americans in the Chinese mind. Some thirty miles out of the total length of 700 miles of the railway mentioned had already been built, and the Chinese had found the traffic on this short section so surprising that they now fully realize what a profitable undertaking a railway is in such a thickly populated country. This will result, Mr. Leslie thinks, in making it almost impossible for any foreigner to secure a railway concession in the future. While on this subject, he remarked that the Canton people dreamed of railway connection with Harbin, and a trip to Paris by the Trans-Siberian in seventeen days, when the Canton and Han kow line was completed.

CANADA'S SHIPS FOR FAR NORTH

OTTAWA, June 14.—It is expected that two Government cruisers will be of the Canadian possessions in the Far North. One under Major Moodie employed this season in the patrol will be assigned to Hudson Bay, the other, under Captain Bernier will be sent further North to explore what is known as Baffin Bay, Lancaster Sound and Smith Channel, probably as far as Cape Sabine, which was visited by Commander Lowe three years ago. Major Moodie will transfer the headquarters on the Mounted Police from Fullerton to Fort Churchill. A new post will also be established on Baker Lake at the head of Chesterfield Inlet on the West coast.
