### EXPECT TO GO TO DARDANELLES

Mrs. M. Jarvis of this city has received the following letter from her husband who is now in Shorncliffe, England.

Shorncliffe Camp, Eng. Aug 29th, 1915  
Dear Wife:—I received your kind and welcome letter today and was very glad to hear from you again. This is the third letter I have written to you but have only received one from you. It takes a letter a long time to go

from here and back again, that you will write to me twice a week, whether you get one from me or not and then I will be getting mail regular. Well wife, it is a pretty exciting place here, there are one hundred and thirty thousand soldiers here. We are still about fifty miles from the firing line, and don't know where they are going to put us yet, but I think that they will send us to the Dardanelles. Johnny went to the front last night to France. Let me know if Bernet is married, I heard that she was. We are only getting a little money here, they say that they are sending it home. But I don't know whether they are or not. Well wife we are likely to be here a long while, may be a year or two, could you send me some tobacco and when you write again write me a good long letter and tell me all the news. Tell Florida that Herb is going to get today. Tell mother that I have not had any letter from her or Bernet and let me know if Henry Derion at home, and how Angus McCormack is getting along and tell Angus to write to me. So this is all for now, hoping to hear from you soon. Give my love to Mrs. Derion and Florie. Write soon from your loving husband.

### SUSPECTED STEAMERS ARE SEIZED.

LONDON, Sept. 20.—The steamer Juno, of Gothenburg, laden with 990,000 pounds of lead, was stopped by order of the Swedish authorities as

she was about to sail ostensibly for Stockholm, according to a Reuter's despatch from Malmo. It was suspected that she was bound for Agena-man port. The Swedish steamer Aero, which left Malmo a few days ago for Stockholm with a cargo of oil and oats, is reported to have been seized by German torpedo boats and taken to Stet-

tin, the German authorities announcing their readiness to pay for the cargo. In consequence of these incidents a decree was promulgated by the Swedish Government directing that hereafter no goods, the export of which is prohibited, shall be transported from one Swedish port to another by water, but solely by rail.
