MR. MELLISH AND MR. HECTOR.

Rev. Mr. Hector, a minister of the Methodist Church, employed by the Dominion Alliance to do special work in promoting temperance, himself widely and favorably known, came to this city some weeks ago, not for the first time, and delivered a number of addresses, in Grace Church and the Opera House. We think that the general sentiment of the sober portion of the community is that these discourses were inspiring and helpful. That the rum element was offended appeared a natural result. But the lawbreaking rum-sellers do not take the platform or write for the public press over their own signatures. No doubt they would like to have hit back at Mr. Hector but for obvious reasons they did not care to do so openly. Mr. Mellish who appears to have abundant leisure, takes up the role of assailant by innuendo and insinuation. His letters, in so far as they have any intelligible meaning, can only convey to his readers the impression

That Mr. Hector is untruthful. This is naturally regarded as a reflection, not only upon Mr. Hector, but upon the Church of which he is a minister, the city pastors who associated themselves with him on the platform and in the pulpit, upon the Dominion Alliance which employed him as a spokesman, and upon the temperance cause to which Mr. Hector has devoted years of strenuous advocacy. Mr. Mellish advances his insinuations unsupported by any legal evidence, in the absence of the man whose character he impugns. So far as any charge could be formulated from Mr. Mellish's letters it is a charge of exaggeration and egotistical untruthfulness. There are those who think Mr. Mellish himself quite as open to the charges of egotism and exaggeration as he implies Mr. Hector to have been. We offer no opinion upon that point. Let the public who have heard them both be the judges. We deem it right to insist that Mr. Mellish shall come into the court of public opinion, if at all, with clean hands. If it be an offence to insist upon this; to defend the absent; to expose cowardly tactics and unworthy motives; to stand by the Dominion Alliance and the city churches against the imputations expressed and implied of Mr. Mellish, then we most cheerfully plead guilty of the charge.

And verily Mr. Mellish has his reward. He has gained a little notoriety with little monetary outlay. Already his praise is in all the saloons. Beery breath extols his cleverness. And should he choose to devote a few hours of idleness daily to the work of destruction there are still other clergymen and other promoters of temperance who might be assailed. An itch for writing and a taint of envy will furnish the motive. But we hope that he will pause before proceeding further and count the losses of such a course. The respect of the ministers, of the churches, and of the sober and orderly portion of the community is still worth having.

AUSTRALIAN TROUBLES.

It may be remembered that after the federation of four Provinces into one Dominion in 1877 there followed a time of much dissatisfaction. Nova Scotia bent all her energies to obtain a repeal, and in New Brunswick also there was much restlessness for a time. But all this has passed away and the Dominion, since largely increased in area, is now prosperous and content. Troubles of a more serious character have followed the union of the Australian Colonies. An almost unprecedented drought has followed the political union, and the states of the federation are beset with deficits. An entire year devoted to tariff discussion has further unsettled the affairs of business and industry.

The New Zealand correspondent of the Toronto Monetary Times writes that dissolution of the federation seems to some statesmen the only cure for existing evils. The Queensland Legislature has been recently discussing resolution "that it is desirable to take steps to secede from the Commonwealth." The Queensland Premier, although not squarely supporting the motion, said that he was prepared to assist in obtaining relief. In South Australia the Premier of that State has publicly stated that if the question of union had to be decided over again, the voting would be solidly adverse. The correspondent adds that the opinion is all the States, with the possible exception of Victoria, is the same. But we venture that this too shall pass away. The union is not a bad thing, but a good thing. When the drought passes, and when the different states, again prospering, become used to their new political relations the history of our own Dominion will be repeated in the far South. The federation was a step forward, and will never be retraced.

A TEMPERANCE SUNDAY.

Next Sunday the 23rd inst is by appointment of the International Sunday School Committee to be observed as "The World Temperance Sunday" For a large majority of the Sunday schools of the Christian world the subject of temperance will engage the attention of the members of the schools.

It has been the custom in many churches to supplement the teaching of the Sunday school on Temperance Sunday by preaching special sermons on that day dealing with the subject of the day. As a special effort is now being made to enforce the P. E. I. Prohibitory Law the Temperance Committee of Charlottetown respectfully suggest that it would very appropriate for all the clergymen of the Province at this particular time, to preach temperance sermons on the date indicated. It is further suggested that if the evening service in Charlottetown be selected for the temperance sermon it would make a desirable uniformity.

St. James' annual lecture course, which has always been of a high order, was opened very auspiciously last evening.

Some native taxpayers are occasionally summoned to court and mulcted in costs for non-payment of taxes. Yet His Worship the Mayor thinks it befitting his high office by his casting vote to remit to a company of outsiders some \$500 a year for 20 years or, say, \$10,000 in all!

A large sum of money is raised from year to year in Charlottetown to send missionaries to the heathen, and this is well, but it is clear that more attention must be given to the savages and vandals in our midst. Of such are the miscreants who on Monday night broke down and destroyed the trees on the west side of Prince Street from the City front to Kent Street. The outrage shows a determined and persistent malignity that should lodge the perpetrators behind prison bars. We trust and hope the City authorities will spare no reasonable effort in the way of detective skill supplemented by the offer of reward, in order to bring the guilty party to justice and make an example of him.

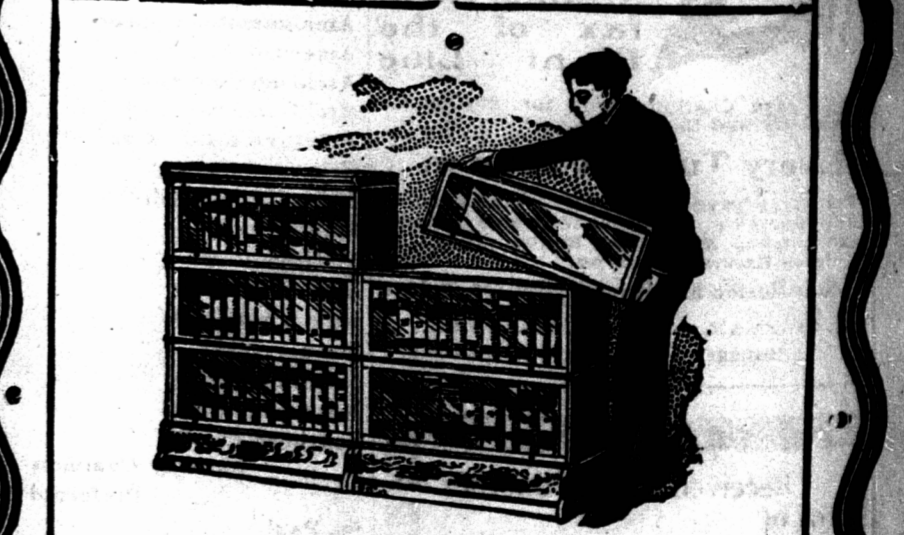
