"SACRAMENT AT MURRAY RIVER—The Sacrament of the Lord's Supper will be observed at the Church of Scotland, Murray River, on the second Sabbath of August, the 13th inst., the pastor Rev. Ewen McDougall officiating. At former sacraments the congregation has been seriously annoyed by the thoughtlessness and irreverence of certain people who took advantage of the occasion by making it a regular outing day, motoring on the river which flows near the church, and by other unseemly conduct. The church session is determined that this year no such desecration of the Sabbath shall be permitted and a committee has been appointed to see that any breach of the Sabbath or any unseemly conduct on the part of thoughtless visitors shall be dealt with as the law directs. This is a friendly warning to the thoughtless; the others know what is or is not conduct befitting the Sabbath. As the church is very near the river owners of motor boats are respectfully requested not to use their boats or allow them to be used in conveying visitors to the church or in any unnecessary motoring as, during service the noise of the motors is very distracting to the worshippers.
