The latest laws, first of all. Supreme Court opens in this City tomorrow. Miss McKenzie of Flat River, is visiting in this City. Chas. Lyons, City, returned Saturday from New York. A large number of citizens enjoyed a walk on the Hillsboro ice yesterday. Miss Blanche Finlayson, City, was a passenger to Georgetown last night. Mrs. James Stewart, Mt. Herbert, has returned from a visit to friends in this City. Arthur Vimicombe, City, leaves tomorrow night for Ottawa where he has accepted a position. Robert Roberts, of Winsloe Rd., is the possessor of a splendid span of the Clydesdale mares recently imported from Scotland. The Stanley took from Georgetown to Pictou Saturday morning, four cars out six cars way freight, besides mails and a number of passengers. The Minto arrived at Georgetown from Pictou Saturday morning at 10.10. She brought two cars way freight, thirty-five passengers and ninety bags mail. Among the visitors in this City Saturday were John McLean, Souris; Miss L. M. Montgomery, Cavendish; H. D. McEwen, Morrell, and G. P. Docherty, Cardigan. The service in St. James' Presbyterian Church, City, last night was in charge of the Laymen's Missionary Movement, Consul Hale, J. P. Cordo and T. C. James led the service very acceptably and presented their subject very forcibly. The closing meeting of the week of prayer was held in St. James church on Saturday evening. The speaker of the evening was Rev. Mr. Floyd who gave an earnest and thoughtful address on the Signs of the Times. Prayer was offered by Rev. D. McLean and W. S. Louson. Although the services have been well attended and a much deeper interest in church work is being manifested. At the Police Court Saturday morning James O'Brien and Reginald Harrington were fined \$5 for thirty days each for being drunk. They were next tried on another charge of breaking windows of Leonard Meek's house Friday night at eight o'clock. Meek testified that they came to his house at that time and demanded admittance. They brought a keg of beer. His wife refused to admit them. They said they would smash in. She told them if they did they would get up with the law. They about broke in all the panes of one window three out of another window, three out of the upstairs window, and one out of the front window. They also broke the sashes. They got into the house, and went to sleep on the dishes. They broke some of the dishes on the sideboard. The total damage was between eight or nine dollars. They were about 1 1/2 hours in the house. Hudson McLeod, who was with the boys, but he broke nothing. Witness said he saw both the other fellows break the windows. O'Brien stated that he broke no windows. Harrington said that he went to the house to get a watch that he lent to him, that McLeod and he were both struck by bottles that were fired by someone in the house. McLeod getting badly cut about the head. They asked that McLeod be subpoenaed to give evidence for the defence. Their request was granted and the case was adjourned till Monday. O'Brien was then put on the stand and was asked where he got the liquor which made him drunk. He said he got a twelve gallon keg from Halifax two or three days before Christmas. It was not a temperate stuff but pretty good beer. He lost the oil of lading. There were about eight gallons in it Friday night. He didn't know what became of it. They took it out to Meek's Friday night, and since then have lost trace of it. He didn't know what became of McLeod either. He paid \$4.50 for the keg, sending it in a registered letter to Halifax. He got a receipt for it which he lost. His brother, Dan, registered it. Perhaps he's got the receipt yet. The case of James Doyle, charged with the larceny of a keg of beer from the Marine wharf, also came up for trial. Evidence was given by the time keeper at the Marine Wharf who testified that his book showed that Doyle was working on the wharf on the twenty-fourth. Walter Monteith, T. Hogan and J. Preston also gave evidence. Doyle was remanded till today at the request of his counsel, Mr. McLean. 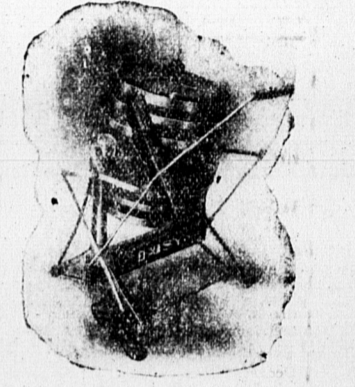
