**I. C. R. TRACKMEN GET INCREASE.**—The C. G. R. management has granted all trackmen on the government railways, including the Prince Edward Island Railway, an increase in pay of 25 cents a day. Other foremen and men in the maintenance of way department, including the bridge and building employees, such as masons, carpenters, painters and concrete men are granted an increase of 20 cents a day, and all monthly paid men an increase of \$5 a month. The increases granted date from June 1, 1916. The management has also granted an increase of two cents per hour to laborers about the shops and roundhouses, including coal shovelers, ash pit men and stores department gangs, increase to date from June 1.
