It is disturbing to note the sharp increase in the number of highly dramatic crimes in recent years. They follow, in most cases, one of the other of the threadbare patterns of trashy books.

It has been well said that we ought never underestimate the power of a book. It sows seeds of good or evil in the human heart. Unless we very soon begin to exercise greater care, encouraging good books and discouraging the bad, we shall be faced with an impossible situation.

This can be achieved, in part, by stricter legislation. But by itself effective it demands concerted and wise efforts to discourage writers from producing them, vendors from selling them, and the public from buying them.

There is a reason for this. Bad books and bad pictures disturb the normal imagination. It is not so much the actual ideas which they implant in the mind that are so harmful, as their suggestive effects upon the imagination. Our imagination is one of our richest faculties. It can fill our life with experiences more wonderful than words can express.
