Papers, Metals Display Strength At Montreal

MONTREAL, Jan. 22 — (CP)— Selected paper and metals displayed strength on the stock exchange and cut by market today in an otherwise flat market. Majority of the stocks moved in a narrowly irregular channel.

Activity of the Abitibi stocks held the spotlight in the paper group. The preferred issue was the most active and jumped 1 5-8 points while the common and prior preferred each gained 1-4.

The action of these issues gave rise in the stock to the expectation that the company's bonds will be refunded in the near future, thus paving the way to the paying of dividends on the preferred shares.

Other winners in papers were International, up 1-4 and Royal three-point gain and M and O, 3-8 higher. Consolidated was active
