### THE BRITISH SYSTEM APPROVED

When our American cousins threw off the British "yoke" and set up business for themselves they excluded everything British from their political and social life. The best feature of the British constitution, a cabinet responsible to parliament, they would not have, and they even changed the rule of the road, and for a century past have turned their backs to the right instead of the left because the latter plan was British. Their experiences of the British colonial system in those days were bad enough in all conscience but Britain, too, has learned much since the days of '76, and the colonial system of England is now the best model that the world knows anything about. The colony remains a crown colony until its people show that they are fitted for self government, and then they are given full control of their own affairs.

It is interesting to note that now our neighbors are acquiring possessions beyond the seas they find something to admire and to copy as well, in the British colonial system. General Merritt, the clear-headed commander of the United States forces in the Philippines, thinks the best his country can do is to adopt the British plan as something that cannot be improved upon. In a recently published interview he said:

"How, in your opinion, should the United States govern the Philippines?" "I believe that we should adopt the English colonial system, which I think is the best in the world. The Philippines should be ruled over by a military resident or governor, having practically absolute power."

"Politicians would seek to Yankeeize the Filipinos, and that would be the greatest possible blunder."

"It is impossible to Yankeeize them and any attempt would be an awful failure."

"The English do not seek to Anglicize the foreign people under their control. On the contrary they respect and foster the national traits."

"By the way, when we entered Manila we wound hundreds of Big Big flags flying from the houses. Every Chinaman had one displayed. They have absolute confidence in the English government."

This is a high compliment to the British colonial system, and it is well deserved. The "absolute confidence" of the Chinese in the British government affords eloquent testimony to the fairness and justice with which the colonies and dependencies, as well as subject races are everywhere treated under the Union Jack.

In the West York, Ont., election case it appears that a voter had accepted a plug of tobacco in consideration for his vote. At the trial he said he did not value his vote at anything but the tobacco was worth ten cents!

In the editorial sanctum one gets a little too much of Christmas. The exchanges come in for days, and from distant points for a week after the event, with little else in them than what pertains to the annual visit of Santa Claus. That sort of thing, excellent at the time, does not improve with age.

The Toronto Star tells that 5,000 young men of the proper age have protested against bringing Hobson to Canada on a lecturing tour. They need have no fears. Hobson is not an aggressive osculator, and the Canadian girls would not repeat the demonstrations that made Chicago ridiculous.

The tallest sky-scraper in New York is the Park Row Building of 29 storeys, which towers 390 feet above the pavement. It will accommodate the floating population of a fair-sized country town. It contains 950 separate offices, most of which are of generous proportions, and suitable to convene four persons in each office. It is reasonable to assume that at a given hour there will be in the building one visitor for each person employed. This would make a total of 8,000 persons at almost any period of the day. It is estimated that 25,000 persons, on an average will enter the building on every working day of the year. Yet this wonderful building is built on the sand. The foundation was driven full of piles, and these covered with cement and granite support the enormous weight of 54,000 tons. From the bottom of the foundation to the top of the flag-pole is a distance of 501 feet.
