OBJECT LESSON FOR SCHOOL TEACHERS

How to Live and Save on a Salary of \$400 a Year: Some Pretty Close Figuring Which Might be Found Hard to Work out in Practical Experience.

(New York Evening Post.) A school teacher who earns \$400 a year supports a family on the income and lays by \$200 a year, has been found in Wisconsin. He is A. H. Zander, and he explains: "We not only live on my income of \$400, but we lay by \$200 of it every year. We live in a small country place in Wisconsin, and, of course, rent is cheaper in a village than in the city. We have a small garden for raising vegetables. We are a family of four, my wife, my boy of three, a little girl of one, and myself."

little Zander boy, who will be four. For Mrs. Zander \$3 for "dresses" will buy much good stout calico, and in some remote historic age the good woman had a heavy dress, which is now made over from year to year to supplement the calico gowns. It is in the furnishings of the table however, that Schoolmaster Zander is really liberal. In the first place, written over the kitchen door, as it were, we find the motto—"Eggs cost less than meat and nourish just as well." Yet regularly eight times a month meat is cooked and eaten in that frugal household. Two pounds of butter and six quarts of milk a week go to the Zander household. Fifteen bushels of potatoes, raised in the teacher's garden, appear and disappear. Thirty quarts of apples, peaches, pears and cherries are garnered and "put up" by Mrs. Zander, and they help wonderfully. For breakfast the good man sits down to coffee, coffee cake, bread and butter, eggs and fried ham. For dinner, after a strenuous morning in the schoolroom, the menu offers boiled cabbage or other filling vegetable, pudding or pie and, to cap the luxurious meal, cafe demitasse. Occasionally pork and beans, sometimes cunningly disguised egg preparations, at times a fat dumpling appear to greet the frugal school teacher at his midday feast. At supper, with memories of the ample breakfast and filling dinner still fresh, remnants of the noon meal, re-enforced by a dish of fried potatoes, and eggs, suffice to satisfy the four Zanders. As a reward for close calculation Zander puts out \$200 a year at interest, which, at 5 per cent., brings him an unexpected and, as it were, unearned \$10 a year for luxuries. One can imagine the Wisconsin economist growing opulent, and the Zanderkin when he comes to 20 years, inheriting a considerable fortune. Why not impress Zander, of Wisconsin, as a lecturer, to go about the country explaining the simple joys of making ends meet on the ordinary teacher's salary?

Too Realistic Acting. An attempt to give a realistic touch to a music hall sketch nearly ended in a tragedy. Miss Geraldine Montrose was playing in a sketch entitled "Snakes." The production is of the very gruesome kind, in which the snakes are allowed to coil round the leading actress' neck. The snakes in this sketch are described as "wild pythons supplied by Cross, Liverpool." In the scene where one is allowed to coil itself round Miss Montrose's neck, the reptile exerted its strength too much, and almost strangled the lady. "She screamed out in agony, and the audience, taking it to be part of the play, applauded. The stage hands, seeing the true state of affairs, made a rush to drag off the python. The curtain was lowered, amid the wild excitement of the audience, whose attention was now riveted on the struggle for the unfortunate lady's life between the men and the python. The snake, by a great effort, was dragged away just in time to save Miss Montrose."

The Decline of Poetry. Probably no publisher in England is better fitted to speak on the market for poetry than Mr. John Lane, and if we can credit an interview with that gentleman reported in The London Daily News, the position of poets is deplorable indeed. A portion of the interview we quote as follows: "Never in the course of my experience of publishing," said Mr. John Lane, "has the demand for poetry been so small as it is now; yet never I believe, has the general average of poetry been so high. I have seen no more striking change in the book world than that involved in the fading popularity of poetry. I would say that a complete revolution has taken place in the last dozen years. "And you think that ten or a dozen years ago modern poetry was not flouted as it is now?" "Very much the contrary. It had not then become fashionable to say that England was artistically dead, and it was possible to publish far more volumes of poetry, each of which had a far better chance of being read. And now poetry, poetry as well as 'minor poetry,' is at a discount. When asked to account for this sudden change, Mr. Lane attributed it to the series of wars which have occupied the public mind since Spain and the United States fought about Cuba."
