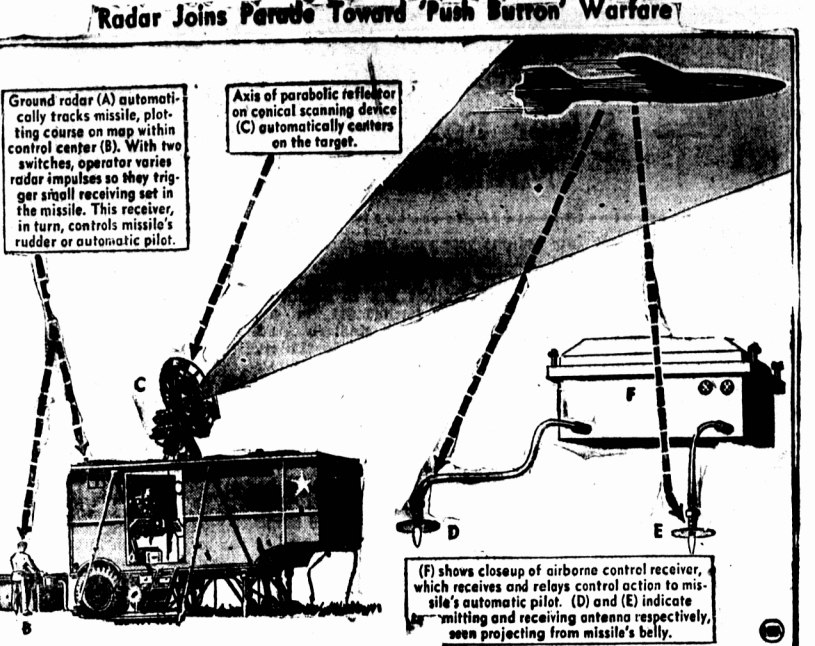


Diagram above, prepared from USAAF Air Materiel Command data, shows how ground radar now can control course of winged "buzz" bombs or rockets, as recently demonstrated at Wright Field, Ohio. Size of missile in sketch is exaggerated—actually it would be far out of sight of control operator. In this, radar control differs from that employing conventional radio waves, as with latter it is necessary for operators to see object being controlled. Research is now under way toward new systems capable of guiding several missiles at extreme altitudes and ranges.

First Post-War Ship Built in Canada on Maiden Voyage

When the Canadian Cruiser sailed out of Montreal recently on her maiden voyage with her holds bulging with Canadian commodities going to the West Indies, it was a forward step in Canada-West Indies trade relations. It was a great stride too in the development of Canada's shipbuilding industry. The first post-war ship to be constructed in the Dominion, the Canadian Cruiser is all-Canadian built. One of three sister ships, the Canadian Cruiser was purchased from War Assets Corporation by the Canadian National Steamships and was built by Canadian Vickers Limited at Montreal. The others, the Canadian Constructor, being built by the Burrard Drydock Company at North Vancouver, and the Canadian Challenger, by the Davie Shipbuilding Company at Quebec, are expected to go into service soon.
