Livestock

MONTREAL, May 14—(CP)—
The daily market report of the Livestock Branch of the Dominion Department of Agriculture said there were 111 cattle, 45 sheep and lambs, 784 hogs and 2,074 calves for sale on the two Montreal livestock markets today.
All classes of livestock were steady, quality considered. The cattle mostly offered were sold on rail made brought \$1.30 hot weight. Feeder hogs were \$9.50 to \$9 according to weight and quality.
The bulk of the calves were of common to just fair quality. Good veals made \$7.50 with a few tops at \$8, and medium kinds around \$6.50. The bulk of the sales were made between \$5.75 and \$6. Very common light veals sold as low as \$5.
Spring lambs were sold at \$5 to \$8 each according to weight and quality. There were no tops. Common light lambs are not wanted.
Sheep were \$4.50 to \$6.
Bacon was \$8.50 fed and watered and up to \$8.60 off trucks. Selects drew \$1 per hog premium with the regular cuts on off grades. Sows were slow at \$4 to \$4.75. Hogs sold on rail made brought \$11.30 hot weight. Feeder hogs were \$9.50 to \$9 according to weight and quality.

EMPLOYEES Earn 22.7% More than in 1929

Italian Navy Sails In to War Spotlight
