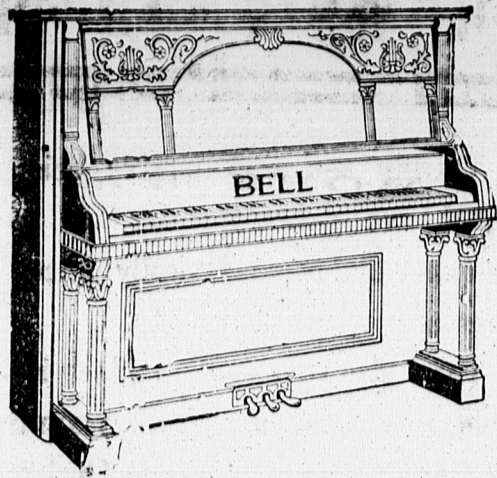

Final Sailings Black Diamond Line steamers from Montreal to Ch'town this season



The S. S. Bonavita is expected to sail from Montreal on or about Nov. 22nd, for Ch'town direct.
 She will be due here about the 25th inst., and sails for St John's Newfoundland via Sydneys and North Sydney C. B., carrying horses, cattle and sheep on deck and produce underdeck at lowest possible rates. This will be the last sailing of B. D. Steamers from Montreal to Ch'town this season.
 The S. S. Cacouna will be due at Ch'town from Sydney, C. B., about the 26th inst. with a full cargo of coal to Peake Bros & Co.
 Should a sufficient quantity of freight offer this steamer will go on the berth about Nov. 30th and load a full general cargo of hay, oats, potatoes, vegetables, butter, eggs, cheese underdeck and horses, cattle and sheep on deck for St. John's, Newfoundland.

Mrs. William Chappell now in her ninety-first year, is still a smart active woman, quite capable of doing almost any kind of ordinary work around a home. During the past eight months she has been housekeeper for a farmer, whose wife died last winter, living two miles out of town. She has done the house work and kept things in good shape without any assistance. On Sabbath when the horse is hitched for her she takes the rig and drives to church. Needless to say she has all her faculties as good as the ordinary person of thirty years younger. When past sixty years of age she had the misfortune of getting her leg crushed and broken by a falling timber. Two doctors were called and they decided that the only thing that they could do was to remove the leg. This she would not allow them to do, telling them that she had been born into the world with two legs and wished to pass out with two. She said "if you cannot save my life with the two legs, I will have nothing to do with you." She called a third doctor and told him to do his best to save the leg. He took charge and the result was that the leg healed and has never caused her any trouble since. She thinks nothing of walking a few miles any day. Mrs. Chappell is the mother of ten children only three of whom are now living. She has worked hard from a child up to the present time. One thing may be remarked, which does not agree with the ordinary health rules, is that she, all through life, up to the present moment, she has practised tight lacing. She never had head ache in all her lifetime. Mrs. Chappell was born in Lot 17, where she has always resided, except when she makes a short trip to the United States to visit her children. She can tell many interesting tales that happened in her childhood days. Mrs. James Ramsay, mother of Thos E. Ramsay, Summerside, who is now in her 94th year, is her aunt by marriage.
