CONVINCED RECOVERY IS DEFINITE

United States Business Leaders Point to Clear Evidence of Business Uptrend.

(By Guardian's Special Wire) NEW YORK, April 2.—The conviction that the United States is definitely emerging from the depression was spread upon the record today by heads of two of the country's biggest industrial units, and by the chief of the Government's most powerful financing agency.

Under Way

Alfred P. Sloan, Jr., President of General Motors Corp., while critical of some aspects of the recovery program said in his annual report to stockholders that "industrial recovery is under way with the irresistible force."

Jesse Jones, chairman of the Reconstruction Finance Corp. in an interview in Washington, pointed to the now definite expectation that the R. F. C. will run \$500,000,000 under budget estimates for the fiscal year ending June 30, as clear evidence of better conditions.

Viewed As Significant

The statements of these three chief executives of business and finance were viewed in Wall Street as distinctly significant at this time, inasmuch as April is often the month in which the peak of the spring business season is reached.
