GOVERNMENT GETTING BUSINESS READY.

OTTAWA, Oct. 13.—The date for the opening of parliament will be fixed by the cabinet tomorrow or Tuesday. It is the desire of the government to open on Thursday, November 14th, if at all possible. The various departments have been asked for reports as to whatever legislation and estimate will be ready by that date and if the reports are not favorable the opening will have to be postponed until November 21st.

Hon. Sam Hughes is now back from England, while the western minister will return Tuesday, so that this week will see full cabinet meetings start in preparation for Tuesday. The premier is anxious to have as much of the important legislation as possible introduced before Christmas. Under the Laurier regime there was practically no work done before the holidays and important measures were delayed until well on in February and March.
