HARBOR GRACE, NFLD., June 18.—Vice-Admiral Mark Kerr, commanding the Handley-Page machine assembled here for a trans-Atlantic flight, announced tonight that before the machine took its final hop-off it would make another trial trip to test new radiators which have just been installed. According to an unconfirmed report this trial trip may consist of a flight to some Canadian city.

German Commander Ordered to Quit

PARIS, June 18.—General Gough chief of the Allied military missions in the Baltic regions, the Temps says, has been ordered by the supreme allied council to address an ultimatum to General Von Dergoltz, the German Commander in Lettvia ordering him to cease all operations against anti-Bolshevik Lettish troops. The Germans also will be commanded to stop all efforts to prevent the establishment of a Lettish Government.

FOUR MONTHS IMPRISONMENT FOR WOMAN SINN FEINER.

MALLO, Ireland, June 18.—Countess Georgiana Markievicz, Sinn Fein leader, and the only woman member of the British parliament, was sentenced to four months imprisonment today on charges growing out of disorders in Cork on May 17. The Countess was alleged to have incited tradesmen to boycott the police and to have participated in an unlawful assembly at Cork.

ROAD BUILDING

HALIFAX, N. S., June 18.—The Nova Scotia highway board has awarded a contract to the Barret Company, Limited, to build four miles of road from Halifax towards Bedford this summer. The cost of the first mile will be \$22,000 and the average will be \$18,000 a mile. Next season two more miles will be built, thus connecting Halifax and Bedford, with a lititlic McAdam road sixteen feet wide.

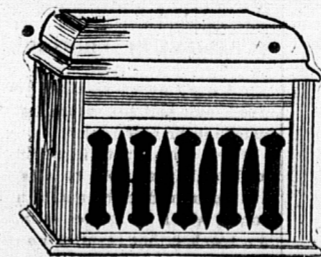
