Convention Discusses Pension Bill

(Canadian Press.) WINNIPEG, Jan. 26.—Suggested amendments to the Pension Act formed the principal items of discussion of the session this morning of the First Annual National Convention of the Canadian Legion of the British Empire, service league being held here. In all nine were approved before the luncheon adjournment, most of which were of a minor character and not regarded by the Assembly as very controversial. One of the principal resolutions was that which asked that the Legion's service bureau of the Legion be notified and given a reasonable opportunity to report prior to pension or disallowance of pension for failure on the part of the pensioner to furnish the statutory declaration provided for by the act.

Vancouver Daily Refutes Liquor Charge

(Canadian Press.) VANCOUVER, Jan. 26.—Emphatic denial that the Vancouver Daily Province ever recorded a single dollar from British Columbia liquor interests without giving advertising space to the full value was made before the Royal Commission by W. C. Russell, advertising manager of the probe. Examined by Hon. N. W. Rowell, K. C., Commissioner in Council, Mr. Russell said that he was present yesterday afternoon when Russell Whitehair, director of the Consolidated Exporter of British Columbia told of contributions by his company to the Sun and the Province for special editions.
