CHICAGO, July 22-(AP)—Strength in cotton and stocks was reflected in the wheat market today with prices showing moderate gains. Wheat ignored the distressing storage situation, as well as the news of a greater spring wheat crop than estimated earlier. Wheat closed 1-4-5-8 higher. July 1.01 1-2, Sept. 1.04 1-8-1.04, corn was 1-8 off, July 72 5-8, Sept. 74 7-8, oats unchanged to 5-8 up, soybeans 3-4 advanced to 5-8 lower, rye 1-4 lower to 1-4 higher, and lard unchanged to 5 plus.

WINNIPEG, July 22-(CP)—Thin trading, with spasmodic mill support and some late hedging, made up a quiet session on Winnipeg grain exchange today as wheat futures prices fell back after earlier gains and closed 5-8-1-2 lower. July at 75 7-8, October 78 and December 79 3-8 cents a bushel. In the coarse grain pit, mills were good buyers in oats, and malsters and shippers were interested in barley although prices reacted on selling later in the session.

NEW YORK, July 22-(AP)—The stock market attempted to tear off another rally today but many of those who were aboard in Monday's sharp runup cashed in sufficient profits to halt the move. The first hour's turnover of 470,000 shares was the largest since Nov. 8, 1940. Notwithstanding the tapering off of activity, transfers of 1,350,000 were the second largest since Nov. 12. They compared with yesterday's aggregate of 905,880 when the market put on its last-minute bulge. The Associated Press average of 60 stocks finished the day with a net loss of 1 of a point at 44.1 but still was in the neighborhood of the year's peak established in January. Southern Pacific and N.Y. Central were the liveliest performers of the day. The former hit a new 1941 top on an opening trade of 10,000 shares. It ended up 3-8 at 13 3-8. The latter finally was thrown for a loss of 1-2 at 13 3-8. Numerous new high marks were registered in the forenoon. Under water at the last were U. S. Steel, Bethlehem, General Motors, Chrysler, U.S. Rubber, Goodrich, Goodyear, Santa Fe, Great Northern, Atlantic Coast Line, Du Pont, J.I. Case, Western Union, Anacosta, Texas Corp. and Montgomery Ward.

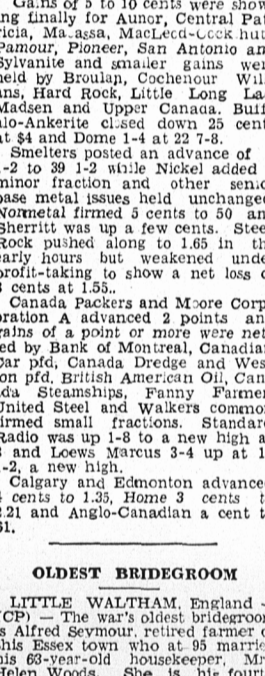

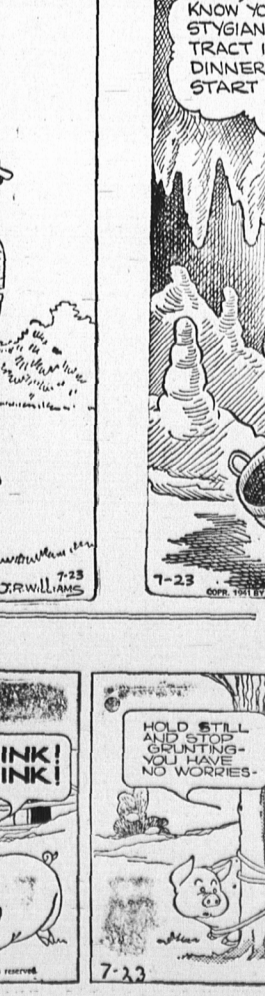
