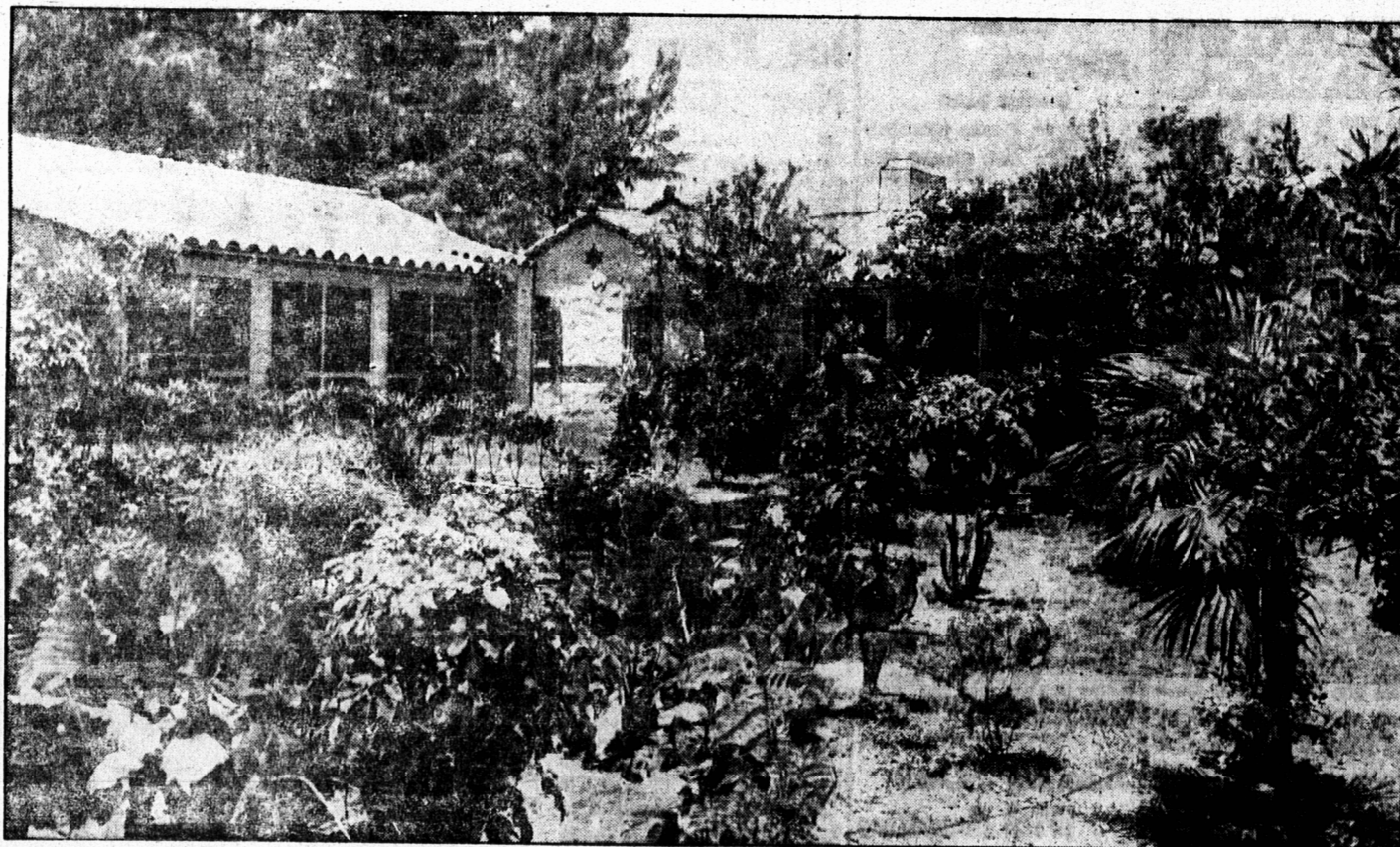

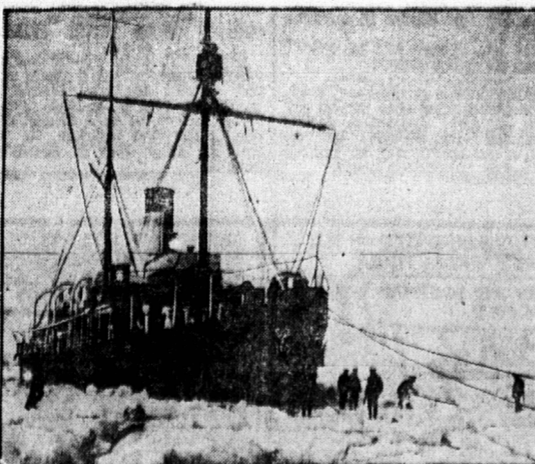

Icebreakers Speed To Rescue Russian Scientists Trapped In Arctic Ice.

Four Russian scientists are stranded on an ice floe off Greenland. The ice, their home for nearly nine months, is in danger of being crushed in a jam. The ice-breaker, Taimir, is shown (Left) picking its way through dangerous seas. Ivan Papanin, leader of the Russian scientists is pictured (Centre) as he packed ice around a tent near the North Pole. Since this photo was taken the group has drifted approximately 1000 miles on an ice floe. Faint radio signals inform Moscow the floe is rapidly breaking up. Three Russian ships are plowing through Arctic seas to rescue Papanin's party. The floe on which they are living is only 100 by 100 feet and is breaking up. Papanin is shown with Comrade Fyodorov (Right) building a snow hut on the floe.
