FINANCIAL NEWS BRIEFS

MONTREAL, July 22—Stock Letter—Fraser's was the outstanding performer in yesterday's somewhat drab Montreal market. Both stock and voting certificates closed at 48, up 2 and 1-2 points respectively. The activity was accompanied by rumors that company would show first half earnings of \$150 to \$2. The actual figures which were released after the close showed a net profit after depreciation and income tax allowance of \$111 per share. The statement was generally considered satisfactory. The encouraging feature being the sharp improvement shown in second quarter. Shawinigan was strong on an announcement of a 33 per cent increase in first half profits. Nickel was easier. Toronto was quiet and prices in all groups somewhat lower. New York slid off a little led in activity by U. S. Steel which dropped off two and seven eighths points to close at 116 1-8. Chrysler continued to rise in the morning and touched 112 1-4 but reacted with the general market to end the day at 110 5-8 off 1-4.

NEW YORK, July 22—The only news of importance this morning is second quarter and six months earnings. Remington's earnings for June quarter reported 81 cents a share against 12 cents last year. Phillip Petroleum \$159 against 1.01 for six months 2.85 against 1.77. Political news is better but it was all known during the course of yesterday's market. We would look for an irregular opening this morning but believe that during the day there will be selective strength. Office business equipment stocks look higher as Remington Rand and National Cash Register. Amusement stocks look as though they might do better, also individual situations such as White Motors and Wesson Oil and Snow-drift.

PARIS, July 22—The government and the Bank of France have signed a contract for revaluation of the banks gold stocks on the basis of 43 milligrams of gold corresponding to 112 francs to the pound sterling, it was announced. The move gives the state a profit of more than 6,000,000,000 francs which will be placed in a fund to support government bonds, previously the banks gold stock had been revalued on the basis of the old franc as the franc at present is far below '12 and the stock still is undervalued. The contract provides that on liquidation of further bond supporting fund or exchange equalization fund, the balance will be payable to the bank against advances made to the state. The franc slumped in foreign exchange trading today. At noon the U. S. dollar was quoted at 27 franc and the British pound was quoted at 134.50 francs.

DISSOLVES BOARD OF BIRTH CONTROL

(By The Canadian Press) NEW YORK, July 22—Dissolution of a committee fighting for recognition of birth control in the United States as a medical and technical problem was announced by its president, Mrs. Margaret Sanger, after her 20-year fight, on the grounds the committee's purposes "have been accomplished."

In an editorial in The National Birth Control News, Mrs. Sanger writes: "This has been my steadfast policy. We have fought for medically directed clinics, for medical support and for medical endorsement and recognition. Time and again members of the profession, even those in high standing, have told us that we could never win. Today we can feel that the same principles of right have won."

The educational work of the movement, she continued, will be carried out under her directorship.
