## A PADRE IN THE GREAT WAR

Being the Reminiscences and Recollections of the Veteran Chaplain, Canon F. G. Scott

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CHAPTER 4  
FESTUBERT AND GIVENCHY  
May and June, 1915

When our men came out of the line, the 2nd Field Ambulance was ordered back for rest and re-organization to a village called Ouderdom three miles to the Southwest and their O. C. invited me to follow them. It was late in the evening when I started to walk. The light was fading and as I had no map I was not certain where Ouderdom was. I went down the road, delighting in the sweet smells of nature. It was with a sense of unusual freedom that I walked along with all my worldly possessions in my haversack. I thought how convenient it was to have one's kit. Now I could lie down beside my haversack and feel better get some roof over my head for the night. I asked various men that I met where Ouderdom was. None of them knew. I was forced once again to take my solitary journey into the great unknown. It was therefore with much satisfaction that when quite dark I came upon some wooden huts and saw a number of men round a little fire in a field. I went up to one of the huts and found in it a very kind and courteous middle-aged lieutenant who was in charge of a detachment of Indian troops. When he heard I was looking for the Field Ambulance and going towards Ouderdom, he told me it was much too late to continue my journey that night. "You stay with me to-night," he said, "and in the morning I will give you a horse to take you to your men." He told me that he had been living by himself and was only too delighted to have a companion to talk to. He treated me as royally as circumstances would permit and after a good dinner he gave me a blanket and straw bed on the floor of his hut. It was very pleasant to come out of the darkness and loneliness of the road and find such a kind host and such good hospitality. We discussed many things that night and next day I was shown over the camp. Later on the lieutenant sent me on horseback to Ouderdom. There I found the Ambulance encamped in a pleasant field beside a large pool, which afforded us the luxury of a bath. I shall never forget the two restful days I spent at Ouderdom. I blamed the blankets, however, for causing an irritation of the skin which lasted till I was able to have another wash and change.

## AGRICULTURAL HIGH SCHOOL

As the result of the co-operation between the Dominion Live Stock Branch and our Local Department of Agriculture a series of lectures and demonstrations are being given to the students at the Agricultural High School Messrs Jones and Boneyman are the lecturers.

The following is the outline of the course:

Introduction—Origin of poultry; Different classifications of breeds and varieties; Genetic; commercial; The place of poultry in farm practice; Extent of poultry industry; its value economically.

Care, Management and Housing—Day-old chicks; The young flock laying pens; Breeding pens.

Feeds and Feeding—How to feed; Kinds of feed; Balanced ration; Utilization of by-products; Value of milk, green feed and meat in the ration.

Breeding—Inbreeding. Line breeding; Need of constant selection; Value of trap-nesting and culling; Importance of male bird.

Incubation—Natural; Artificial; How to use an incubator. Kinds of incubators; Selecting the eggs. Brooding.

Marketing—Eggs; Necessity of candling; Market requirements; Value of co-operative marketing; Poultry; Necessity of careful grading and packing, also proper finishing. Dressed and live poultry markets.

Demonstrations—Flock culling; Egg candling; Killing and dressing.

Pens of selected stock are kept at the School Poultry House. The trap-nesting system is in operation and official records are kept. The purchasing of feed and feeding and the keeping of records are done by the pupils themselves. During the month of January, sixteen birds laid 253 eggs an average of 16 per month. Two birds laid 24 eggs each. The total cost of feed for the month was \$4.56, being an average of one cent per day per bird. Eggs netted \$12.00. The net profit per bird per month was 44c.

In considering these figures it must be kept in mind that all feed was purchased at prevailing market prices.
