DUTCH SCOUR ASH HEAPS TO SAVE WASTE IN FUEL.

(Canadian Press Despatch)

WASHINGTON, Nov. 23.—Scarcity of coal due to the war, has driven the Dutch to the ash heaps for fuel. Coal-solar reports today describe a method of grinding the refuse from furnaces, and passing it through a liquid which separates that having high value from cinders and ashes. It is said that two thousand tons of refuse produce 22 tons of fuel.

Synopsis of Canadian Northwest Land Regulations

THE sole head of a family or any male over eighteen years of age, may homestead a quarter section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. Applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the District. Entry by proxy may be made at any Dominion Lands Agency.

Notes—Six months residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 80 acres, on certain conditions. A habitable house is required except where residence is performed in the vicinity.

In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter-section along side his homestead. Price \$5.00 per acre.

Notes—Six months residence in each of three years after earning homestead patent; also 50 acres extra cultivation. Pre-emption patent may be obtained as soon as homestead patent, on certain conditions.

A settler who has exhausted his homestead right may take a pre-empted homestead in certain districts. Price \$5.00 per acre.
