Agricultural Meetings

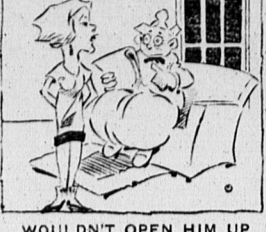
