Mr. D. Nicholson M.P. Discusses Conditions in P.E.I.

The Montreal Gazette reports that Mr. Donald Nicholson, M.P. for Queens, P. E. I., was at the Windsor Hotel on Wednesday, where he discussed the affairs of the Island, dwelling particularly upon the prosperity which is enjoyed by all classes there. There was a time, he said, when every hand on the Island would be held up for reciprocity with the United States and no party would be strong enough to resist such a policy. But all this has changed and today there is no longing whatever for reciprocity with the American Republic.

The price of cheese has increased on the Island from eight cents to twenty-two, potatoes from sixteen cents to \$1.20, butter from sixteen to forty cents, oats from thirty to seventy-five cents a bushel, pork from five cents to eighteen cents a pound, and eggs from eight and ten cents a dozen to twenty-four, and other farm products accordingly. The increases in agriculture, he said, had brought a good many people home who had gone to the United States and elsewhere, and prosperity reigns at the present time all over the Island.

Prince Edward Island, the member for Queens said, has given three thousand men to the Empire, made up into two battalions, a line regiment, and drafts to the other branches of the service, which the Islanders think is a pretty good contribution considering that the population of the garden province is little more than a hundred thousand souls.

He thought Conservative sentiment was quite as strong as ever in the Lower Provinces and believed that Sir Robert Borden will do better down there in the coming election than he did in 1911.

He expects that the two terminals will be completed both on the New Brunswick and Prince Edward Island side by this fall, and as the ferry boat is already completed, it is quite in operation before the winter season begins.

"We went over at five o'clock," said he, "and I was not hit until nine. It was the finest four hours of my life. I got over four lines of German trenches. It was like a magnificent fourth of July celebration. The exhilaration of fighting in an army so well prepared that nothing can stop it is like nothing else in the world."

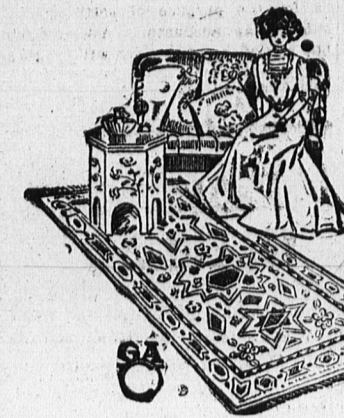
