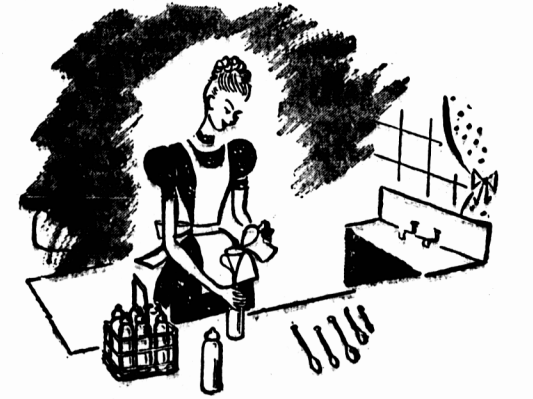

Russia To Aid In Spitsbergen Defence

MOSCOW, Jan. 14 - (Reuters) - Soviet Russia tonight set out her position on "the necessity of joint defence (with Norway) of the Spitsbergen Archipelago" in a statement issued by Tass, official Soviet news agency.

It reaffirmed that an understanding had been reached on this issue in negotiations with Norway in 1944-45, and added that an exchange of opinions "in the spirit of previous negotiations" had taken place in 1946 between Foreign Minister Molotov of Russia and Halvard Lange, Norway's Foreign Minister.

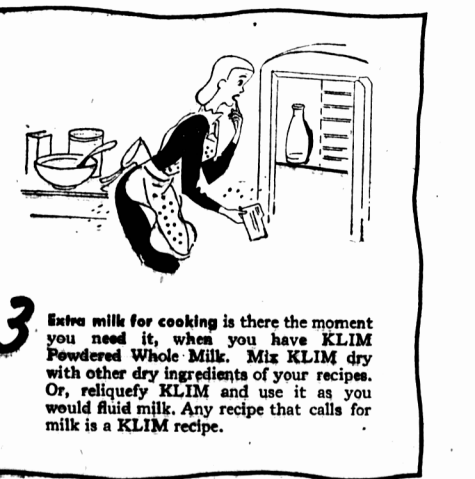

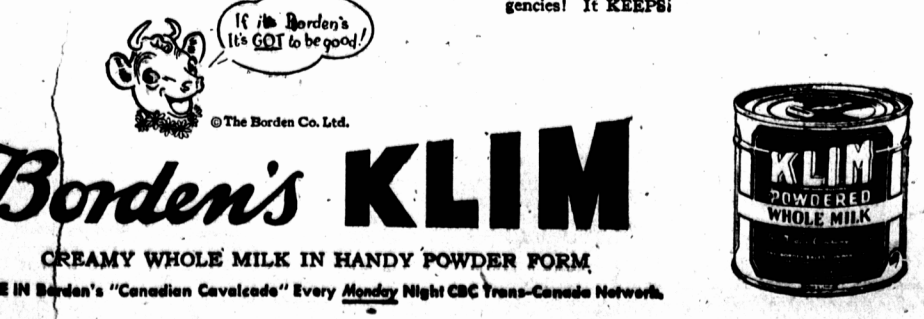
