Stock Prices Rally On N. Y. Exchange

NEW YORK, March 12—(AP)—Stocks produced their first rally in nearly a week today in an atmosphere of nervousness over foreign affairs.

President Truman's recommendations to Congress for financial and advisory aid to Greece and Turkey received close attention in Wall Street where doubts over international prospects have been widespread.

The Associated Press 60-stock composite climbed 4 1/2 points to 645 for its first advance since March 6. Total transactions of 950,000 shares compared with 1,190,000 Tuesday.

McIntyre with a gain of 5 1/2 led Canadian issues. Canadian Pacific was up 1 1/4 and Distillers Secogram gained 1-8 while Dome Mines was unchanged. On the curb Lake Shore moved up 1-4.

Pennsylvania Railroad finished 1 1/2 points higher at 23 after declaration of a 50-cent dividend.

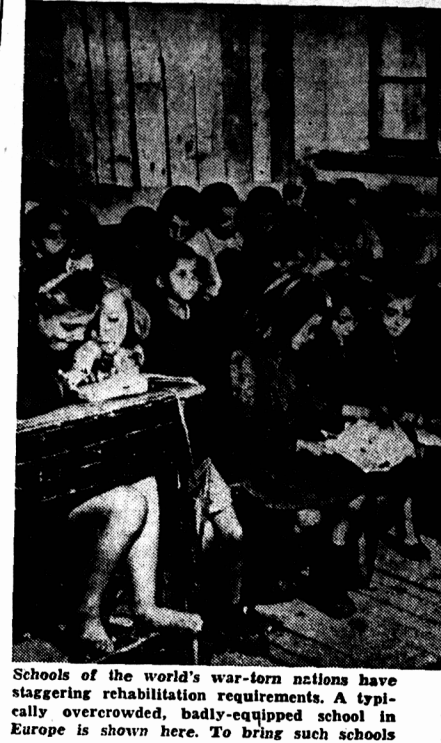
Better performers included Alcoa Chemical ahead 2 1-2 at 169 1/2; U. S. Gypsum, up 2 at 97 1/2; U. S. Steel 1-4 at 72 5-8; General Motors 7-8 at 58 3-4; Southern Railway 1 5-8 at 43 3-8 and Pncps Dodge 1 at 40.

Johnson & Johnson jumped 5 3-4 to close at 60 3-4 on a proposed 100 per cent stock dividend.

Other gainers were Bethlehem, American Telephone, North American, Commonwealth and Southern, American Can, Westinghouse Electric, International Harvester and Boeing. Chrysler, after an early gain of more than 2 dipped around 3 points from the day's high before recovering to finish up 3-4 at 95 1-4.

Chesapeake and Ohio touched a new low ground for the year and closed at 48 1-2, off 7-8. Among other losers were Union Pacific, Dow Chemical, Douglas Aircraft and Johns Manville.

Papers Show Recovery Tendencies At Mt'l.

MONTREAL, March 12—(CP)—Individual papers showed recovery tendencies while balance of the list was about mixed in quiet dealings on the stock exchange and curb market today following decline in the first two sessions this week. Volume was well under 200,000 shares.

Montreal Power, Cub Aircraft, St. Lawrence Corporation, Massey, Consolidated Paper, B. C. Forest, Pnc and Imperial Oil were among more heavily traded issues.

St. Lawrence Corporation was a leader in papers and closed up a point at 13 1-2 while Consolidated Paper led at 17 5-8. B. C. Forest advanced 1-2 at 58 as a result of a pleasing dividend declaration. Fraser upped 3-4 and International 1-2.

Pluses and minuses were about evenly distributed in a narrow industrial section. Cub Aircraft increased 25 cents at \$1.80. Massey finished unchanged at 19 after a temporary rise and Cockshutt lost 1-4. Seagrams lost a lift in liquor and Canadian Breweries was off 1-4.

Montreal Power ended down 1-8 at 24 1-8 in utilities after exchanging at 24 1-4 through most of the day. Shawinigan advanced 1-4 and Brazilian held steady.

Trading box score: Total sales, lost 3-8 in a quiet metals sector and Imperial was 1-4 better at 13 3-4 in oils.

Mines were dull and featureless. Trading box score: Total sales, 155,200 shares; industrials, 45,800; mines, 119,400; stocks higher 55; lower, 62; unchanged, 63; new highs 4; new lows, 21.
