EMPEROR WILLIAM'S RELIGION

Leading Authorities of Church and State Say HIS MAJESTY'S ORTHODOX BUT THINKS THAT PARTS OF THE OLD TESTAMENT BEAR EVIDENCES OF HUMAN MANUFACTURE.

"I believe in the one and only God. We may need a fork in order to teach His existence, especially for our children. This fork has hitherto been the Old Testament. The present version of this will be positively and substantially modified under the influence of research through inscriptions and excavations.

Other portions of the Emperor's letter to the Admiral not contained in the paragraph given to the press, include the following personal views regarding the revelation. "I distinguish between two different kinds of revelation—one progressive, and, as it were, historical; the other purely religious, as preparing the way for the future Messiah.

"The second form of revelation—the more religious—is that which leads to the manifestation of our Lord. It was introduced with Abraham, slow but forward looking and unscientific, for humanity was just without it. Now begins the most astonishing activity of God's revelation. Abraham's race and the peoples developing from it regard faith in one God as their holiest possession, and it follows, hold fast to it with iron like consistency. Split up during their Egyptian captivity, the divided elements were again welded together by Moses, ever trying to hold fast to their monotheism. It was the direct intervention of God that caused the rejuvenation of this people, thus proved through centuries, until the Messiah, heralded by prophets and psalms, finally appeared, the greatest revelation of God in the world, for he appeared in the Son himself. Christ is God, God in human form. He redeemed us and inspired us, entices us to follow him. His Intercession saves us. Conscious of his victory, building solely upon His word, we go through labor, ridicule, sorrow, misery and death, for we have, in Him, God's revealed word and he never lies.

"That is my view of these matters. It is to me self-evident that the Old Testament contains many sections which are of a purely human and historical nature, and are not God's revealed word.
