Surveys Brighton Bridge Project

Mr. G. A. MacVeay, chief bridge engineer for the Province of New Brunswick, is here at present making a survey of the prospects of building a bridge from Brighton Shore across West River to the Rocky Point side.

Questioned yesterday, government authorities stated there was nothing "final" about Mr. MacVeay's survey, which is a preliminary reconnaissance to determine the feasibility of the scheme as a link in a long-advocated highway to Bondy by a route several miles shorter than the existing highway.

Mr. MacVeay's work will be followed this winter by punching through the river ice to determine the depth of the channel.

If the report is favorable it is proposed to suggest the scheme to the Dominion Government as a suitable postwar project. Provincial authorities made it plain, however, that there is no assurance from Ottawa that either the bridge or the highway will be built.

The project was strongly discussed in the Legislature last session, particularly by the members from the West River district.
