

Interpreting The War

High drama in Washington marked completion of the United States aid-for-Britain legislation and President Roosevelt's quick request for a \$7,000,000,000 appropriation to carry it out.

Even before the first American-made plane, ship or gun under the program goes forward to test Nazi bomb and U-boat challenge at sea, White House technique has definitely scored. It has noched British morale to a new high at a critical hour. It has also stirred obvious apprehension in Berlin as to its effect upon Balkan neutrals sweating under Nazi power-politics pressure; and upon Japanese and Russian policy-making.

That President Roosevelt had such objectives in mind goes without saying. His genius for seizing the psychological moment for dramatic words or action is too well proven through his years in office to doubt it. Instead of signing his appropriation request piecemeal, he lumped them into a single, staggering \$7,000,000,000 item and thus challenged Hitler, the master propagandist of Europe, in his own chosen field.

A reiterated Nazi threat to torpedo even United States warcraft if they attempt costly duty is less significant than a fantastic Nazi propaganda broadcast on the subject.

That presented to German ears the utterly incongruous view that United States strategy in aiding Britain is aimed at inducing a "negotiated peace" in Europe which would leave Washington free to gather in valuable fragments of the disrupted British Empire.

That version is such an utter

distortion of the American aid-Britain policy that it indicates Nazi propaganda agents may be apprehensive as to how the German public, to say nothing of tottering Italy, will take the \$7,000,000,000 thunderbolt.

Between the lines of the reiterated Berlin chant, that Nazi torpedoes will deal with American aid for Britain can be read the admission of the converse of that boast. If U-boats and planes cannot halt that aid, if the Nazi sea offensive of 1941 fails as did the German land offensive and sea blockade in 1918, the end of the Nazi-Fascist career will be in sight.

Mass Production Of Shipbuilding Being Studied

OTTAWA, March 13.—(CP)—Mass Production methods of shipbuilding are being studied by the Department of Munitions and Supply in Canada. It is their adoption in Canada if practicable, munitions Minister Howe told the House of Commons tonight.

He said these methods, which involve making parts of ships in different plants and bringing them together for assembly, had been tried for a short time in the United States in the first great war but not long enough to prove their practicability.

"We are going all out on the building of cargo ships," said the Minister. "We are going to build as many ships as we can build on a reasonably economic basis."
