OTTAWA, Bedt. 27—Ottawa's Conservativ enthusiasm, pent up for 15 long years, found spectacular vent to-night. The elaborate public Demonstration arranged by the Ottawa Conservative Association, in honor of the victorious Conservative Leader, burst of the most enthusiastic out- rival of acclaim ever given to Sir Wilfrid Laurier, when he was the victor instead of the vanquished. Fully 20,000 persons lined the route of procession which escorted Mr. Borden, Mr. Perley and two local members, elected. Frupp and Chabot through the principal streets. 10,000 people were in the triumphal parade of flag bedecked motor cars, carriages and supporters mounted on foot. The parade was a mile long.

That Vancouver will in time become the shipping centre of the Pacific Coast, with Canada the great bond between the British Empire and the United States, was the contention of President Jacob Gould Schurman, of Cornell University, a native of Prince Edward Island, when seen by an interviewer upon his arrival from the North. He said that Vancouver and Prince Rupert would occupy the same relative positions in Canada that San Francisco and Seattle now hold on the American side. This is the first time that President Schurman has visited the West since 1900. He was amazed at the development of the province and of Vancouver particularly. There was nothing, he thought, that could hold back either city or province now, for located as the Western outlet to the great wheat lands of Canada they were both bound to play a very important part in the development of the country. "The English-speaking people may be termed in a broad sense the Empire of Peace," continued President Schurman. "Canada is the pivot upon which that great activity will turn. President Schurman is returning from Alaska and the Yukon with his son and two daughters and after visiting here will go east, via Calgary, Edmonton and Winnipeg.—Vancouver Exe.
