**PROHIBITION AND PARLIAMENT.**

Parliament has been now nearly a month in session and a good many matters have been talked over, but very little has been said and we have no intimation of what is to be done in regard to the great question of prohibition. There can be no excuse on the part of public men that this matter has not been brought to their notice. From the date of Confederation down to the present time petitions have poured into the two Houses asking for advanced temperance legislation. The organized temperance bodies have petitioned, the evangelical churches have memorialised, four or five of the provincial Legislatures have passed resolutions asking the central Parliament to pass a prohibitory law. There have been plebiscites in a number of the provinces with vast majorities calling for prohibition. There was once a federal Royal Commission on the subject under the Conservative Government and there was the Dominion plebiscite of 1898, showing a majority of the Dominion in favor of a prohibitory law.

Twenty-two years ago local optional prohibition was given us in the form of the Canada Temperance Act, which has remained upon the statute book since that date. It is in the nature of things that we ought to go forward and not backward in these matters, and the best public sentiment of the country has never ceased to demand that a forward step shall be taken. This feeling was accentuated by the result of the federal plebiscite and when the Government refused to act upon the verdict of the majority it was at least hoped that Parliament would take the partial step of conceding prohibition by provinces, so that in those sections of the Dominion where prohibition sentiment was strongest, the well-understood wishes of the people might be crystallised into law. This reasonable hope and expectation of the people has also been brought to the notice of Parliament. Surely it cannot be said that our law-makers have not been kept fully informed in regard to the public desire and demand for a forward step.

So far nothing has been done. The fact is only too apparent that the leaders of both parties are either inert or hostile to the prohibition movement. Now we are approaching the close of the present Parliamentary term. It may, and probably will be that the current session will be the last session of the present Parliament. In that case it becomes the friends of prohibition in the Commons to be on the alert. It is most important that every member of the House shall be placed squarely on record on this question before the next appeal to the people is made. Let it be known who among our federal legislators, who unanimously ordered the plebiscite to be taken, are now in favor of, or opposed to giving expression to the wishes of the majority as therein expressed.

We trust that the question of prohibition by provinces will be brought up for consideration in good time—not shunted off till the rush and hurry of the closing days of the session—as is too frequently the case with questions involving the moral welfare of the country. Nothing would be so pleasing to the liquor interest as to have this matter shut out from discussion till after another election, and nothing could be more unfortunate for the prohibition cause. It will require both courage and persistence by the friends of prohibition in the House, to prevent the question being wholly relegated to the back ground as no doubt the party leaders desire it shall be. But we trust the friends of prohibition will stand to their guns, and when the test vote comes that every Island representative will be found voting as the great majority of the Island people would have them vote. Already the delay in bringing up the prohibition question in Parliament is causing anxiety among thousands of electors throughout the Dominion.
