THINK THEY HAVE SOLVED DANGER OF LEVEL CROSSINGS

WINNIPEG, March 5.—At room 14, C.P.R. Telegraph Block, corner McDermott and Main Street, is to be found a model of a remarkable device which has been patented by Winnipeggers for the purpose of affording greater safety at Level Crossings over the different railways in Canada.

Those who have seen the model working claim that it will revolutionize anything now in operation for the safety of the public at the different level crossings scattered broadcast throughout the country.

The different railway companies have for some years been on the outlook for some apparatus which will afford the greatest protection at level crossings for both man and beast and several prominent railway men have expressed the opinion that Winnipeg genius has given to the world such an apparatus in the "Coulter Safety Level Crossings Device" recently patented in Canada, United States and elsewhere.

The machine is remarkable for its simplicity and for its accuracy, the severest tests being used to show that it was not a mere toy, but a device which will ultimately be used on every railway in Canada, where the safety of the public is at all taken into consideration by the railway authorities.

The device is an automatic one. Briefly described the invention consists of a series of short flanges set at intervals at a distance from the crossings on the outer side of one set of rails only. The device requires three flanges to operate it. On the engine striking the first flange a warning bell which is self-winding starts ringing at the level crossing, and continues to do so until the train has passed.

As soon as the train reaches the second flange a semaphore is raised to the pedestrian or those crossing the railway, and lowered to the train crew and engineer. At night a red light is turned to the road and a white light to the train.

The last flange operates a cattle guard which is lowered and locked down as the train approaches and raised and locks again when the last car passes, thus affording perfect security. The cattle guard is considered by those who have seen it to be the best yet invented.

As the flanges are placed on both approaches to the crossings, those met by the train after leaving the crossing serve to re-wind the bell in preparation for the next train.

The system not only gives ample warning to the pedestrian, but also affords the engineer an opportunity to see whether the warning signals have been given at the crossings, should by any possible contingency a signal fail to be made, then a semaphore is raised and a red light is turned to the engineer.

The whole system is entirely automatic, no electricity being used. The bell is self-winding and the light is created by flint steel and gasolene.

The whole system is worked by three cables in conduits placed under the rails to a depth which will afford every protection in the severest weather.

The 85 pound standard rail will be used and the flanges are to be placed at the following distances from the crossing: First, which winds the bell, 800 yards; second raised and lowers semaphores and throws signal light 600 to 700 yards and the third which lowers the cable guard, 300 yards from the crossing. A spring is attached to the cables which practically removes the impact of the train on the device.

The whole system has been thoroughly criticized by competent engineers of the railways and railway commission who all prophesied a great future for the apparatus. They recognized that this block system is a complete apparatus that has been invented.

A company has been formed, operating under the Manitoba Charter for the purpose of furthering the use of the device on Canadian Railways. The headquarters of the company is Winnipeg, and its present capital stock \$100,000.

Considerable interest is being taken by many prominent railway men in the success of the enterprise, it being realized that the solution of the level crossing menace was near at hand.

GERMANY'S RELATIONS WITH THE VATICAN.

BERLIN, March 5.—In a speech before the Diet yesterday, Chancellor Von Bethmann-Hollweg admonished the Curia that persistence in its recent tendency to the issuance of decrees affecting Germany, without previous consultation with the Government would lead to retaliation.

The speech was diplomatically phrased, but its one could not be mistaken.

The announcement that the Chancellor would discuss the relations of the Government with the Vatican served to fill the hall.

QUEBEC MAN CONFESSED TO MURDER

ST. LEONARD, De Nicolet, Que., March 5.—Hornidas Trepanier, a farmer, 45 years of age, of St. Leonard De Nicolet, was arrested at his home today by Chief McCaskell, of the provincial police, for the murder of Maurice Plouffe, whose body was found on the road between Three Rivers and St. Leonard De Nicolet on Thursday night. Last night Chief McCaskell states that Trepanier confessed he had killed Plouffe by stabbing him in the neck, and smashing his skull in with an axe. The murder was committed in Trepanier's stable and the body afterwards taken out and left on the main road where it was found Thursday night by Joseph Lord, a general storekeeper, of St. Leonard De Nicolet, who was returning from a business trip to Three Rivers.

Trepanier confessed that he and Plouffe had been drinking, and while under the influence of liquor he had killed Plouffe for the money he was supposed to have in his possession. Trepanier said he had only got a few dollars.

Chief McCaskell told Trepanier that he did not believe he had only secured a few dollars as Plouffe was known to have a large sum with him when he left Three Rivers at the beginning of the week. But the prisoner insisted that it was only a few dollars that he had secured.

Trepanier was placed under guard in a room in the Colonial Hotel, and tomorrow morning will be taken to Three Rivers and placed in jail to await the enquete in the case. He has a wife and one child.

NEW YORK HIPPODROME.
