From the School for the Blind in Halifax he received much encouragement and assistance. Under special tutelage from that institution he became an apt student in learning to read the Braille type and he especially enjoyed reading the Word of God under this system. He was highly appreciative of this kindness and also the efforts put forth on his behalf by the medical profession and the staff of the Prince Edward Island Hospital. The funeral service took place from his late residence on March 10th and was attended by a large circle of friends. Rev. G. Carlyle Webster of Zion Presbyterian Church, Charlottetown, conducted the service giving an appropriate and comforting message from the text, "Blessed are the dead who die in the Lord from henceforth; yea, saith the Spirit, that they may rest from their labours and their

work do follow them." Rev. 14:13. There are left to mourn his departure his sorrowing mother and one sister, Mrs. Stanley Nicholson, Glen Valley. The father and another sister, Katie May died several years ago. Interment took place in the family plot in Hartsville cemetery. The pall bearers were Messrs. Ned, Peter, and Doderich Nicholson, Everett MacLeod, John McLennan and John Gillis, all cousins of the deceased.
