WINTER NOVELTIES AT THE EDEN MUSEE.

A special effort is made at the Eden Musee of New York City, to make the attractions offered appropriate to the season. Many of the wax groups represent winter scenes and these have been carefully rearranged and given new features. The wax figures standing in the Lobby are wearing winter clothing on account of the cold weather. A number of new figures and groups have been added, including Cardinal Farley, in his robes of office. The group "People Talked About" has received a number of new additions, and the youthful Emperor of China has bid adieu to the other members of "Rulers of the World." In the Winter Garden, special attractions are given afternoon and evening. Elmo, the magician has extended his engagement two weeks, and will present new illusions and feats of magic. A new collection of moving pictures has been received from abroad and different sets will be hourly afternoon and evening. Many of the new pictures show winter scenes and sports in different countries, varying from the exciting coasting of northern Norway to bathing in the Sandwich Islands. Other pictures show humorous scenes and reproductions of important events. The afternoon and evening concerts will be continued with choice programs.

HOLD UP IN THE SENATE BY LIBERAL MAJORITY.

OTTAWA, Feb. 14—The Government, today, declined to accept the amendment of the Liberal majority in the Senate to the Enquiries Bill at the deadlock stage. It will come up again on Thursday.

The motion of Senator Cloran to defeat the bill for-bidding pollution of navigable waters was defeated and the bill given third reading.

In Committee on the Government bill to amend the Enquiries Act, Senator Kerr moved an amendment to section 12 as follows: "No reply shall be made against any person until a reasonable notice has been given him of the charge of misconduct alleged against him, and he shall have been allowed a full opportunity to be heard in person or by counsel."

RESOLUTIONS PASSED BY OUR LIVE STOCK MEN.

OTTAWA, Feb. 15—The passing of two important resolutions and election of officers was the principal business transacted last night in the concluding session of the National Live Stock Convention. The resolutions are as follows:—

Resolved that the Legislation requiring Stallion registration, already existing in four provinces, be extended to the other provinces:—

Resolved that the Dominion Government adopt a policy for the control and eradication of bovine tuberculosis, along the line recommended by the International Commission on the control of bovine tuberculosis.

AMERICAN ESTATE TAXED IN ENGLAND

LONDON, Feb. 12—The fight of the Duke of Manchester to prevent British taxation officials from levying a duty on the estate of Consuelo, Dowager Duchess of Manchester, an American woman whose personal fortune aggregates \$2,000,000 has been lost. Today the courts handed down a decision in the case ordering the executors of the Duchess' estate to pay the tax upon the American portion as well as the English portion of her riches.

PRINCESS LAUDS YANKEE WOMAN

CHICAGO, Feb. 12—"I like America and Americans. American women are beautiful and inspiring. Of course, I am constantly meeting American women in Paris, and did not have to come here to find their many good qualities."

In the above manner Princess Paul Troubetzkoy gave her impression of Americans. Chicago society has not yet recovered from the sensation caused by the visit of the dainty Parisian wife of the noted Russian sculptor and exponent of the "simple life." They will remain in Chicago for a month longer, while the exhibit of the Prince's work is holding away, and during that period they will be lavishly entertained.

Princess Troubetzkoy was asked to give a comparison of New York and Chicago, which elicited the following tactful reply:

"I found New York magnificent; I find Chicago splendid."

The Prince's turbulent career in Russia is well known. His advanced ideas did not appeal to the royal household, and he was arrested and put into prison. It took months for him to clear himself of the charges. When finally set free he left Russia, never to return, and has made his home in Paris.

Princess Troubetzkoy was before her marriage Amelie Rives, the eccentric, almost mysterious author of "The Quick or the Dead," and many other books. Her marriage a few years ago to the Russian Prince created almost as much of a sensation as her first marriage to J. Armstrong Chanler, great-grandson of John Jacob Astor. Chanler was said to be the hero of her famous book, and the marriage was considered an ideal love match.

Two months after the ceremony they separated and a divorce was granted. Prince Troubetzkoy appeared on the scene, and within a few weeks after the granting of a divorce, the former Mrs. Chanler married the dashing Russian.

SEVEN MINERS DEAD; 30 OTHERS ENTOMBED

BERLIN, Feb. 12—Seven miners were killed by a fire damp explosion in the Litanda mine at Antoniet, Prussia, Silesia, today. Thirty other miners were entombed alive. Rescue party were at once organized, but mine officials said there was little chance of saving any of those buried.

FEAR THAT WATCHMAN WAS BURNED TO DEATH.

BUFFALO, Feb. 12—One life is believed to have been lost, a fireman was hurt probably fatally and \$150,000 damage was done by a fire which destroyed the plant of the Bingham trunk company yesterday.

Albert Jones, watchman of the building, has not been seen since the fire and probably was burned to death.

While fighting the flames on the fourth floor six firemen were cut off from the stairway. They climbed out from the window ledges, but the spread of the flames was so rapid that within a few seconds they were forced to swing clear of the windows and to cling to the ledges by their hands.

Before extension ladders could be placed, all six were burned and one of them, William J. Murray, fell to the street. His legs were broken. The others were rescued.

WOBBURN LEATHER FACTORY IS DESERTED BY FIRE.

WOBBURN, Feb. 12—W. C. Welch & Co's patent leather factory, the largest plant of its kind in Woburn, was burned yesterday afternoon, hardly a timber of the main building or addition being left. The loss will approximate \$80,000.
