BOSTON SOLDIERS TO VISIT OTTAWA

OTTAWA, Aug. 14.--About 1,200 United States volunteer militia consisting of the 5th Regiment, Boston (Mass), under Col. W. H. Oakes, the machine gun battery of Rhode Island and an artillery corps and some light infantry from Providence, will arrive in Ottawa on Sunday morning on a visit to the 43rd regiment. They will go into camp at the exhibition grounds and on Monday afternoon will be reviewed on Parliament hill by the governor general.
