NINE MONTREAL FIREMEN DISMISSED MONTREAL, Feb. 1-Nine firemen were today dismissed from the brigade by Chief Tremblay, with the approval of the Board of Control, the offences alleged against the men being drunkenness or absence from duty without leave. Two were particularly bad cases of firemen neglecting their duties while the fire was being fought on Jacques Cartier square last week and Chief Tremblay said it was necessary to discharge the men if the proper discipline was to be maintained in the brigade.

INSURANCE DEPARTMENT REGINA, Sask., Feb. 1-The Government of Saskatchewan will establish an insurance department and place a superintendent in charge who will have complete supervision over all insurance companies doing business in the Province. PENNSYLVANIA OUT OF DEBT PHILADELPHIA, Feb. 1-With funds on deposit at a Philadelphia bank to meet all claims the State of Pennsylvania was practically freed of all interest bearing debt today when bonds aggregating \$1,605,100 matured. The bonds maturing today were authorized in 1881 and were issued to take up maturing loans at that time, some of which came down from Civil War times. Just 125 firms persons or estates held the bonds that matured.

NEW METHOD OF PACKING APPLES. TRENTON, Feb. 1-The demonstrations in apple-box packing conducted in Trenton during the past three days by the Provincial Department of Agriculture have aroused a great deal of interest, and large numbers were present at each session. Throughout the sessions upwards of one hundred and twenty-five fruit-growers attended, eager to learn this method of packing in order to equip themselves to put up their own fruit. W. F. Kydd of Simcoe conducted the demonstrations. The meetings were held under the auspices of the Provincial Fruit Branch, and the district representatives at Port Hope, Picton and Stirling.

NEW HONOR FOR HEARST COBALT, Feb. 1-Word is received here that the name of the town of Grant, a divisional point on the Transcontinental Railway, 130 miles west of Cochrane, has been changed to Hearst by the postoffice department, in honor of Hon. W. H. Hearst, the minister of lands, forests and mines in the Ontario Cabinet.

BULLET HIT AVIATOR. TRIPOLI, Feb. 1-While throwing bombs from an aeroplane into an Arab encampment near Tobruk, in Cyrenaica, Capt. Monte, an Italian military aviator, was severely wounded today. A companion escaped. The aeroplane was struck four times by the Arab rifle fire and one bullet hit Monte.

EIGHT DROWNED IN GERMANY HAMBURG, Germany, Feb. 1-A tug loaded with workmen capsized in a collision with a freighter while crossing the Rhine here this morning, and eight of the passengers were drowned. The helmsman was unable to see the oncoming freighter on account of a heavy snowstorm.

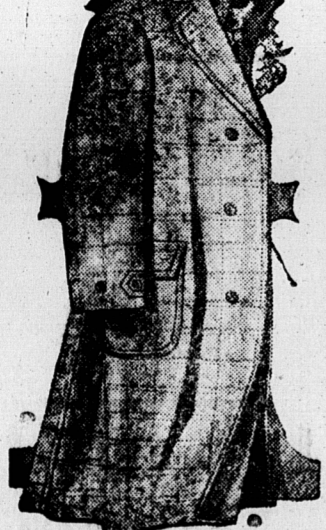
