FORMER PROVINCIALIST ON TOURIST'S PARADISE

BOSTON, July 8, 1912.—Dear Sir:—I notice under the heading "A Tourist's Paradise" in a recent issue which interested me somewhat, as I was long a resident of your city, and my father, the late Isaac C. Hall, for some ten or twelve years kept the summer resort known as "The Hotel Acadia" at Tracadie.

Now I want to say in all kindness that your people could probably take in a million dollars annually if you began to take the interest, and make the investments and expenditures necessary to get your share of the increased summer vacation business which with every year grows more and more lucrative, wherever natural attractions exist and are properly utilized. But your people, with a perfect summer climate and marine surroundings, do little or nothing to encourage people to stop over there when they visit you. You charge a man outrageous license fees if he wants to shoot a few black birds, or catch a mess or two of trout. There isn't one tourist in a dozen who brings a gun or rod with him, who gets five dollars worth of trout or game in a three weeks sojourn, and you have simply no large game, and very occasional chances at flight birds in the summer season. If you would change the law and issue weekly or monthly licenses, for the convenience of the large class who seldom stay a month, at a nominal price, you would make more money on licenses and help your very few hotel-keepers who cater to this trade.

You ought to have twenty or thirty good beach houses and doing a good summer business, if you advertise as you should do, but you haven't the houses, and your mercantile transportation lines and business organization seem to be indifferent to their own interests, for every tourist who can find comfort and sport in P. E. Island, spends very freely and is always anxious to visit you again. I had rather spend a "hot season" in Prince Edward than any place I have ever visited, but I can't advise my friends to go to a place where they cannot be sure of comfort, bathing, boating, fishing, shooting etc, except at a cost and inconvenience which is intolerable in its experience and results.

If you want people to visit you, to stay for weeks, and to spend their money, you must do something more than have "its advertising done largely by visitors." There are too many millions of dollars and live business communities competing to make that way of "boosting" a success.

I have always said that Charlottetown should have a good all the year round hotel somewhere about the old Douce property, with summer (unfurnished) extensions for tourists' trade. It should have motor-boats, teams, and "guides" to run them and take tourists to fish, shoot, paint, and take photos, etc, etc, and have above all a good cook for fish, meats, and game, with plenty of vegetables, berries, cream, milk and butter, such as P. E. I. is famous for.

Thousands of well-illustrated, well written circulars should be kept in the railroad, steamship and summer resort exchanges of the big cities, and every information given in advance so that the tourist can make up his route at leisure. Your legislature next winter, should change your present license law, which gives you no revenue and doesn't save your game, but keeps away the man who would be perfectly satisfied if he shot
