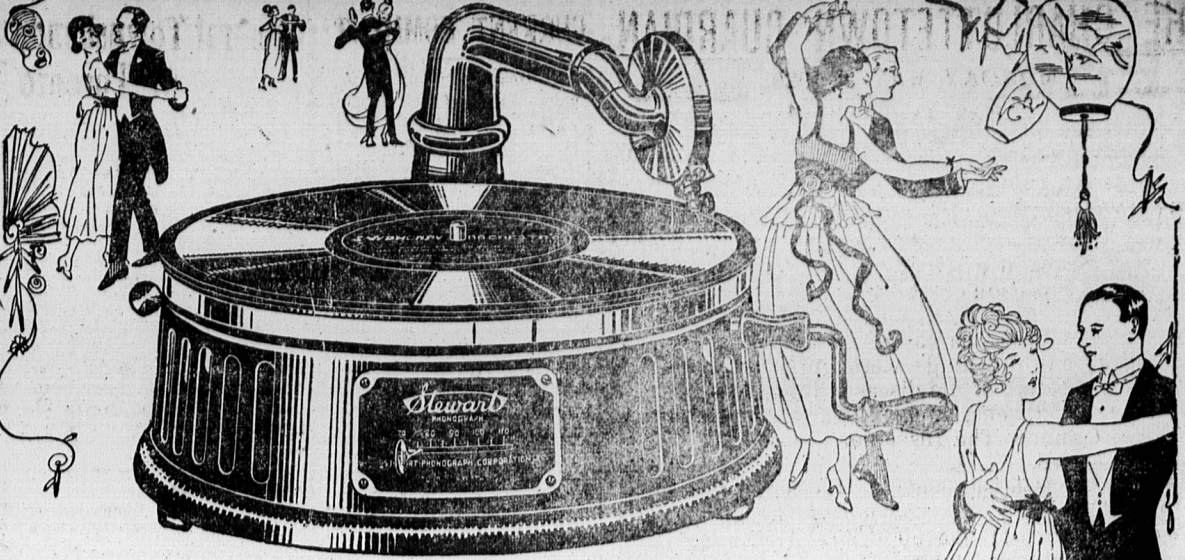

ANNIVERSARY OF LUSITANIA'S LOSS.

LONDON, May 7.—Five years ago Friday the transatlantic liner Lusitania was sunk without warning by a German submarine off the southern coast of Ireland. This outrage was one of the most diabolical in the whole German programme of unrestricted submarine warfare. Of the nearly 2,000 persons aboard the Lusitania 1,150 lost their lives. One hundred Americans were included among those who perished and the disaster was one of the most potent influences in arousing American sentiment in favor of war against Germany.

The fifth anniversary of the disaster was observed by special prayers in many English churches and by a special service at the Lusitania cemetery in Queenstown. A number of Americans took part in the observance at Queenstown.

Commutation Fares Have Advanced

Increase On All Canadian Railway Lines Dates From May 1st

Effective May 1st, Commutation Fares have advanced on all Canadian Railways, and patrons of the Canadian National Railways have been advised that ten trip tickets purchased prior to May 1st, will not be honored, but should be handed in to the nearest ticket agent so that refund of the unused portions may be obtained.

Patrons are also advised that this increase in Commutation Fares applies to ten trip, fifty trip and scholars forty trip tickets. Ten trip tickets are limited to three months, instead of one year as heretofore, while regular fifty trip and scholars forty trip tickets are limited to one month.

All who are holding these tickets should at once put them in line for redemption, either to the nearest Ticket Agent, or to the General Passenger Department, Moncton. 8703-5-7-41
