IMPORTED BURGLARS.

From time to time burglars and other criminals from across the border try their hands of exploiting Canadian territory. They make raids into the Dominion, commit thefts, robberies, burglaries and other crimes and escape with ill-gotten gains into the United States. Last year a series of burglaries were committed in Parkdale, Dundas and Aurora, Ont. for which three notorious professional American burglars were suspected and sufficient evidence found against them on which to base a demand for extradition.

These men were Rice, Rutledge and Jones. They had escaped to Chicago. They had plenty of money and apparently had powerful friends as well and made a stiff fight against extradition. For some strange reason there is on the other side a strong local sentiment against permitting even the worst of criminals being extradited to Canada. The guilty persons themselves have also a wholesome dread of Canadian law and of Canadian courts and juries.

In this case, however the prisoners were extradited and brought from Chicago to Toronto. In the Parkdale case the jury disagreed. While the trial for the burglary at Aurora, which followed, was proceeding the prisoners made a bold and determined attempt to escape, murdering a constable in course of their attempt, but failed to get away from the officers in charge. They will now be tried for the graver crime and will very probably end their careers on a Canadian gallows.

The desperate attempt of the prisoners to escape forms a rare and thrilling chapter in criminal annals. The trial for burglary was approaching completion and would have been concluded in the ordinary course on the following day, June 5. At 6 o'clock, after the adjournment of the Court the prisoners were being removed to jail in a hack in charge of County Constable Jones inside and Constable Stewart outside with the driver. The prisoners were securely handcuffed, and for additional security two of them were shackled together. With these precautions escape seemed impossible.

But the the prisoners had an accomplice outside and as the hack neared the jail this unknown man came alongside and quickly threw three loaded revolvers in among the prisoners. The prisoners seized the weapons and, shackled as they were, opened fire. Constable Boyd fell at the first shot with a bullet in his brain and died in a few minutes. In the meantime Constable Stewart from outside the hack had opened fire, and had wounded one of the prisoners in the groin. The hack was stopped, the prisoners jumped out and boarded a passing street car, presenting their revolvers at the breast of the

motorman to force him to run his car out into the country, and so assist their escape.

The motor man, was brave, and though unarmed, refused their demand. He instantly set the brakes and removed the brake handle and then struck out with his fists. At the same time the conductor removed the trolley from the wire, thus effectually stopping the car. After a desperate fight Constable Stewart and the hackman overpowered the prisoners and they were taken to jail. The accomplice who supplied the revolvers in the meantime had made his escape. The incident stands greatly to the credit of the peace officers, the motor man and the conductor on the street car. They, and especially the brave officer who fell, deserve as well at the hands of the country as soldiers who peril their lives on the battlefield.

Yesterday's despatches from Toronto tell that Rutledge, one of the prisoners, after being sentenced for burglary, was killed while again attempting to escape.
