Morning Stock Letter

NEW YORK, Oct. 28—Although Iron Age reports that in some sections there has been a let down in steel operation, the outlook for the remainder of the year continues favorable. The American Petroleum Institute reports gasoline stocks down 133,000 barrels, crude oil output up 2,700 barrels. Electric Power output report this morning is comparatively favorable. American Rolling Mills in addition to the regular quarterly dividend declared an extra dividend of 75 cents. Dividend meetings today are American Tobacco, Anaconda Wire and Cable, Armstrong Cork, Bristol and Myers, Ingersoll Rand, Union Bag, and Westinghouse. The merger of Nash Motor-Kelvinator terms are published this morning. Nash Motor is going to give 1 1/2 shares of Nash for each share of Kelvinator. Although the earnings of U.S. Steel published after the close last night were not right up to expectations, the fact that directors declared the regular quarterly dividend on the preferred is a favorable development. We would look for an irregular firm market this morning and believe there is good chance that the oils will do better, especially New Jersey, Indiana, Continental and Texas Corporation.

LIVESTOCK

MONTREAL, Oct. 28—(CP)—Prices were quietly steady today on Montreal livestock markets in calf, sheep and hog sections. There were no early cattle sales.

Good quality veals brought \$8.50, medium good \$8, fair to medium \$7 to \$7.50, common drinkers \$4 and grassers \$3 to \$3.50. Good ewes and wethers sold at \$8, culls and bucks \$6 while sheep were \$2.50 to \$4. Bacon hogs, fed and watered, made \$8 with the usual cuts on off grades. Sows traded at \$5.50 to \$6. A few dressed weight hogs sold at \$10.70 rail grade. On the Maritime section hog prices eased from 50 to 65 cents. Rail grade sold at \$10.50, live hogs off cars \$8 and off trucks \$7.65. Sows rail grade were \$7.25 and \$5.35 off cars. Steers sold up to \$5.75, cows to \$3.25, canners and cutters \$1 to \$2.25 and bulls \$3. Calves ranged from \$3.25 for grassers to \$7 for veals. Lambs were \$7.50.

TORONTO, Oct. 28—(CP)—A sharply higher London market for copper, lead and zinc gave the base metal listings of the Toronto mining section a substantial lift in today's trading. The golds registered a narrow loss. Volume was the heaviest of the week. Noranda failed to get excited about the \$3 advance per ton for standard copper and in quiet trade a gain of one point was registered. Hudson Bay mined a half point and Falconbridge 5-8. A new high price for recent years was recorded by Sherritt-Gordon at 2.03 and the close at \$2 was up 10 cents. A half dozen golds accounted for the bulk of the action in the yellow metals. Moneta changed hands again in heavy volume, holding 3 cents of an early 8-cent advance.

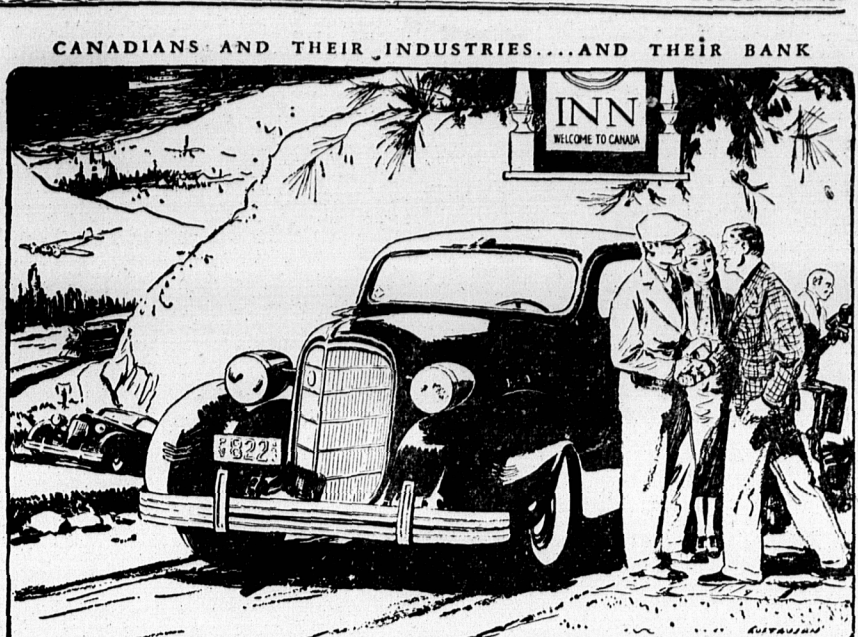
